Arundo donax	£5.20	3.00	Big, bold, clump forming perennials, with stout stems & large, ribbon-like, arching broad green lvs, with a glaucous hue. Terminal panicles of light-green, purple flushed flws. More or less hardy. Ht.5m. spr.1.5m. (8-9)
Arundo donax versicolor	£7.75	3.00	Fast Growing Perennial Grass' The Thick Stems Bearing Broad, floppy, creamy-white striped leaves. Spreads by underground rhizomes. Superb feature plant for retentive soil in a sunny position. Requires winter protection under cover.

Briza media 'Russells	£4.50		Gently spreading evergreen with clumps of pastel-green & white variegated leaves. Airy sprays of silvery lockets on well branched stems quiver in the breeze;- summer. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. 60x60cm.
Bromus inermis 'Skinner's Gold'	£4.20		New clump-forming grass making spreading mounds of rich-green & gold variegated leaves. The small buff yellow flower spikes persist on the plant all summer. Needs sun for best colouration. May become invasive. Ordinary well drained soil
Calamagrostis x acutiflora 'Overdam'	£4.20		An easily grown, attractive grass with upright stems clothed in dark green leaves edged a startling white. Feathery, grey flower heads eventually fade to brown. For sun or part shade in ordinary soil. 120x60cm.
Calamagrostis brachytricha	£4.20		Easy evergreen with arching clumps of ribbon like mid green leaves. Feathery millet shaped purple pink flowers in autumn fade silver grey & become open & feathery. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. (8-1) 90cm.
Calamagrostis epigejos	£4.20		Rare British native, familiar in the Cheddar Gorge. Swirling mounds of very long, fresh green evergreen leaves. Erct 1ft spikes of narrow purplish-brown flowers turning silver grey with age;- August & September. Best in a moist woodland in
Carex 'Amazon Mist'	£1.95	9cm	Looking suspiciously like 'Frosted Curls' re-born this forms evergreen tufts of finely swirling light silver-green leaves. Insignificant flowers. Retentive soil in sun. (6-7) 35cm.
Carex atrata pullata 'KEKE 494	£4.50		Beautiful small evergreen sedge with fine, almost swirling dark green leaves. Arching stems with nodding black flowers which delicately rustle in the breeze. Flowers late spring through summer. Retentive or moist soil in sun or part shade. 30cm.
Carex brunnea 'Jenneke'	£4.20		Showy, evergreen sedge with arching tufts of very fine, dark-green leaves, with a broad, rich-gold margin. Insignificant heads of small brown flowers in summer. Retentive or moist soil in sun or light shade. Good in pots. (6-7) 45x45cm.
Carex brunnea 'Jubilo'	£4.20		Small, tufted evergreen clump former with very fine, dark-green, erectly held leaves with a fine silver-white margin. The rather small brown flowers during late summer add little. Retentive or moist soil in part or full shade, out of midday sun.
Carex buchananii 'Green Twist'	£4.20		An unusual form of this traditionally coppery-bronze grass, this forms fine, swirling tussocks of fresh green leaves with curling, twisting tips. Insignificant flowers. Excellent in pots. Retentive or moist soil in sun or shade. 45cm.
Carex ciliatomarginata 'Treasure Island'	£4.50		A sport on 'Island Brocade' this low growing evergreen has very broad, almost Hosta like grey-green leaves, strongly striped white along with wide white margins. Rather insignificant flowers. Best in a retentive or moist soil in sun or

Carex davalliana	£3.95		At first sight this looks like a fescue with it's tight mounds of very fine, thread like fresh green leaves, looking good all year. insignificant flowers. Needs a retentive or wet soil in sun or
Carex elata 'Aurea' (AGM)	£4.20		(syn.C.stricta Bowles Golden') Graceful, bright golden grass-like foliage. Stiff spikes topped with pointed clusters of brown flowers. Water's edge or damp soil. Sun. 60cms. Flowers:
Carex flacca flacca	£3.60		Loose, evergreen clumps of narrow blue-green leaves with a steely reverse. Long purple-brown flower spikes followed by reddish-yellow seed. Flowers early summer. Forms tight clumps in pots. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. (5-6)
Carex flagellifera	£4.20		Informal clumps of thin, evergreen, long, narrow, warm pinkish-brown leaves with orange tints giving year round interest. Retentive soil; does well in shade. 70cms.
Carex grayi	£6.25	3.00	North American evergreen sedge with broad, glossy, deeply keeled dark green leaves. Showy star like flowers followed by spiky, club like specatcular seed pods. Retentive or moist soil in sun or part shade. (5-8) 60cm.
Carex 'Ice Dance'	£3.85		Rosettes of broad, glossy, Dark-Green Lvs With A Narrow Cream Marginal Stripe. Like A Larger Fisher's Form'. Panicles Of Gren & Brown Flws. Fertile Rich Preferably Retentive Soil In Sun Or Part Shade. (5-6) 40cm.
Carex muskingumensis 'Oehme'	£5.55		Loosely tufted, gently spreading deciduous grass with the upright stems carrying cream variegated lvs held horizontally. Produces of panicles of golden-yellow flws in early & midsummer. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. (6-7) 60cm.
Carex muskingumensis 'Silberstreif'	£4.00		Elegant, erect, deciduous sedge with narrow, ribbon like, mid green leaves having a central silver stripe, turning butter yellow in autumn. Small, airy plumes of brown flowers in autumn. Retentive or moist soil in sun or part shade. (7-9)
Carex oshimensis 'Everest'	£4.20		Forms large, arching clumps of evergreen, leathery glossy green leaves with a wide white margin. Rather insignificant spikes of small brown flowers. Excellent feature plant for a pot or requires a retentive soil in sun or part shade. (6-6) 40cm.
Carex oshimensis 'Evergold' (AGM)	£6.75		Tough, eye-catching evergreen with grass-like leaves of bright gold with a narrow green margin. Makes a good focal point where it can enjoy dampish soil in sun or part shade.
Carex oshimensis 'Everillo'	£4.50		Evergreen tufts of arching, glossy strap like leaves, emerging lime green, turning rich burnished gold as the season progresses. Does not scorch in the sun but needs reasonable levels of moisture. insignificant brown flowers. A sport from
Carex oshimensis 'J.S.Greenwell'	£3.95		Very tough evergreen sedge for even deep shade. Forms arching evergreen mounds of leathery, arching strap like deep green leaves. Insignificant spikes of silvery-buff flowers. Excellent even in drier shade under trees & impossible sites.
Carex panicea	£4.20		Small, running, clump forming evergreen, with narrow, silver-blue tufts of upright leaves. The flowers add very little to the display. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. (5-7) 30cm.
Carex petriei	£4.20		Much like a small C.buchananii. Evergreen clumps of pink-tinged, bronze-red leaves with a distinct central groove & rough edges. Small, bristle-tipped spikes of dark brown flowers. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. 30x45cm.
Carex phyllocephala 'Sparkler'	£6.75	2.00	Clumps of cream-variegated leaves in ascending spirals on stiff stems to 2-ft. high. Excellent feature plant for a pot. Slow & difficult to propagate. Retentive soil in sun or part shade.

Carex plantaginea	£5.55	2.00	Striking evergreen sedge from the eastern states of America with very broad, strap like glossy green leaves forming a low symmetrical rosette. Small brown flowers. Excellent ground cover even in difficult shade. (5-6) 30cm.
Carex siderosticha 'Shimanihiki'	£4.35		Showy radiating stems with very broad golden-yellow lvs with a central green stripe. Creates a swirling ground cover. Insignificant brown flws. Retentive yet well drained soil in sun or part shade. (4-5) 30cm.
Carex testacea	£4.20		Makes elegant clumps of fresh-looking, fine, bright green leaves toning to olive-green at the tips. Evergreen giving year round interest. Retentive soil in sun or shade. 45cms.
Carex testacea 'Prairie Fire'	£6.75		Evergreen, tidy, upright clump former with swirling mounds of fine, keeled, soft yellow-green leaves with coppery-bronze tips, the colour intensifying as autumn comes. Insignificant flowers. Ideal for pots. Retentive soil, colours best in sun.
Carex trifida 'Rekohu Sunrise'	£4.80		A striking new variety making bold clumps of fountain shaped, evergreen, rich green leaves with a distinct soft gold edge. Suitable for general planting or pots in a retentive, yet drained soil in sun or part shade. Ht: 60cms +. Introduced 2009.
Carex umbrosa sabynensis 'Thinny Thin'	£3.95		Gently spreading, clump forming, semi-evergreen with tuft of very thin green leaves with a regular, narrow cream edge. Short stems with tufts of airy cream filaments;- late spring. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. (4-5) 20cm.
Chasmanthium latifolium	£4.20		A very attractive evergreen, upright grass with wide-bladed leaves of a golden-green. Delicate panicles of flattened, overlapping spikelets. Any reasonable soil in sun or part
Chasmanthium latifolium 'River Mist'	£4.50		Clumps of deciduous, rather bamboo like ribbon leaves heavily variegated creamy-white, flushed pink on the new growth. Dangling, copper, oat like heads of flowers from midsummer into autumn. Excellent for cutting. Tolerant of most soils but prefers moisture in dappled shade. (7-9) 80cm.
Chionochloa conspicua	£6.80		Large tussocks of rough, tawny-green leaves, rather drooping & with orange midribs. pale-greenish-yellow, nodding plumes ageing fluffy brown. Needs a sheltered site with good
Chionochloa flavescens	£7.50		Lovely evergreen clump former with narrow leaves flushed brown & orange-red. Heavily branched panicles of pale green to white spikelets in late summer. Retentive gritty well drained soil in a sheltered sunny position. 120x90cm.
Chionochloa rubra	£4.50		Coarse, erect, evergreen, tussock-forming grass with narrow, golden-red tinted leaves. Large airy sprays of drooping panicles of bead-like flowers; mid to late summer. Excellent for drying. Retentive yet well drained fertile soil. 120x60cm.
Chrysopogon gryllus	£4.50		Tussock forming grass, with hairy, light green lvs. Spreading, airy heads of purple-gold flws with purplish spikelets during summer. Likes a dry sandy soil in full sun. (6-7) 120cm.
Cortaderia selloana	£5.45		Big, robust, tuft forming grass with coarse, grey-blue leaves forming a tough clumps. Tall stems carry waving silver-white plumes from late summer through autumn. Prune back hard in spring to prevent it becoming dominant. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (8-11) 250cm.
Cortaderia selloana 'Pointe du Raz'	£7.25		Rather refined form of pampas grass with more or less evergreen tufts of rough green leaves, edged creamy white which are long & wispy. Erect spikes of brush like silvery-cream flowers during late summer into autumn. Retentive, well
Cortaderia selloana 'Pumila' (AGM)	£5.45		Ideal for the smaller garden. 4ft silver plumes over grassy clumps. For a good well drained soil in sun. 1.3m x1.3m..

Cymophyllus fraserianus	£5.20		A really strange woodland sedge from Pennsylvania. Rosettes of very broad, stem clasping glossy green, leathery leaves. Short spikes of bottlebrush like white flowers with a sweet scent from late winter, through spring. Needs a moist, very acid soil in part shade, preferably under trees. (2-4) 30cm.
Deschampsia cespitosa 'Schottland'	£4.20		Erect evergreen with stems topped by initially arching spikes of bead like, rich purple-bronze flowers, exploding as the flowers age ; - mid to late summer. They age golden-buff. Rather insignificant tufts of green leaves. Easy in retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-8) 150cm.
Deschampsia cespitosa 'Tardiflora'	£4.50		A later flowering selection from Karl Foerster with huge, airy plumes of tiny bead like silver-purple flowers continuously through midsummer into autumn. Rather insignificant tufts of fine leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade.
Deschampsia cespitosa 'Tautrager'	£4.20		Airy, arching sprays of tiny, bead like flowers, initially opening silver-green, ageing a soft wheat colour, during mid to late summer. Tufts of rather insignificant green leaves turning coppery brown in autumn. Easy in any reasonable soil in sun
Deschampsia cespitosa 'Waldschatt'	£4.20		Very showy German hybrid with more or less erect stems with sprays of bead like silky bronze-black flowers in airy heads through summer, straw coloured into autumn. Tufts of narrow, evergreen leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part
Elymus magellanicus	£5.65	2.00	Possibly the brightest metallic-blue of any grass. Spreading mounds of lax, evergreen leaves making good ground cover. Attractive, reddish, bristly flower heads; late summer. Well
Eragrostis curvula 'Totnes Burgundy'	£4.20		From Sarah & Julian Sutton. Long arching stems of grey flws in summer. The long, narrow lvs are wine red in the top half, giving a rich effect. Airy grass for a well drained soil in sun. (5-
Eragrostis elliottii 'Wind Dancer'	£4.20		Airy, swirling evergreen forming mounds of arching, thread like grey-green, very fine leaves. Airy. open sprays of very fine bead like silver-white flowers create a delicate haze, during midsummer to the frosts. Do not cut back hard in spring. Best in a sheltered, well drained spot in sun or light shade. (6-10)
Eragrostis spectabilis	£5.65		Dryland species from Maine to Minnesota, this has arching clumps of narrow, light green leaves, turning bronze with the frosts. Airy, feathery plumes of bronze red flowers in late summer & autumn create wonderful autumnal colour. Well
Festuca glauca 'Golden Toupee'	£4.50		A Lovely New Golden Form Of The Popular Blue Fescue' Making Tight Clumps Of Bright Golden-Yellow Foliage. Ideal For The Front Of Border, containers etc. Well drained soil in sun or part shade. 25x25cms.
Festuca glauca 'Intense Blue'	£4.20		Possibly even more a silvery white than than 'Elijah Blue'. Symmetrical domes of very fine, needle like glaucous silver evergreen leaves. Insignificant silver flowers in summer. Divide regularly to keep healthy. Light, poor, free draining soil
Hakonechloa macra 'All Gold'	£5.20		Found in Suzuki En nursery in Kowaguchi, Japan, this grass forms clumps of arching, bamboo like, burnished gold leaves. It is a little more upright than the species. Good autumn colour. Small, insignificant flowers. Retentive soil in sun or
Hakonechloa macra 'Aureola' (AGM)	£4.50		Not seen as often as it's golden counterpart, this delicate almost bamboo like grass has light green leaves narrowly striped cream. Slowly creeps to form dense clumps. Excellent in pots but hates root disturbance. Humus-rich soil with some
Hakonechloa macra 'Nicolas'	£4.50		Taller form , grown chiefly for it's spectacular autumn colour when it turns flame orange & red. Arching, bamboo like stems with strap like glossy green leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. 50cm.

Hakonechloa macra 'Stripe it Rich'	£4.80	A seedling from a batch of 'All Gold', this deciduous clump former has bamboo like leaves of soft gold, each with a central white vein. Foliage turns rich copper in autumn. rather insignificant brown flowers add little. Good in pots. Best in a
Helictotrichon sempervirens 'Saphirsprudel'	£4.20	Sapphire Fountain'. Spreading, evergreen clumps of stiff, intensely steel-blue leaves, with less susceptibility to rust. Brownish-yellow plumes on erect stems add little. Sunny, well
Juncus effusus spiralis	£5.75	A strange perennial with spiralling, rounded, hollow stems creating a tangle. Easy to grow in any not too dry soil in sun or shade. Even thrives in pond margins.45x60cm.
Koeleria glauca	£4.20	A lovely low growing grass with dense tufts of soft silver-blue leaves. Short, dense flower spikes on upright stems. Any reasonable soil in sun. 30x30cms.
Lamprothyrsus hieronymii CDPR3096	£4.80	Wild collected grass collected in Chile by Compton, D'Arcy & Rix. Much like a dwarf Pampas grass with arching evergreen clumps of ribbon like, fresh green leaves. Large, arching, fat plumes of silvery white wands from April-June & August-December. Hardy in a sheltered spot in sun. 1.5x2.0mtrs.
Leymus arenarius	£3.75	(syn.Elymus a.) Although this is a quick spreading, almost invasive, grass it has the most wonderful steely blue-grey leaves. The flower heads are carried on golden-yellow stems. In the wild it is used for stabilising dunes. Free draining soil in
Luzula 'Engel'	£4.15	
Luzula nivea	£4.20	A lovely evergreen rush, forming loose clumps of narrow leaves with silver hairs. Clusters of white starry flowers on arching stems. Moist site in shade. 60x45cm.
Luzula pilosa 'Grünfink'	£4.20	syn 'Greenfinch'. Excellent evergreen ground cover, even for the driest of shade. Creeping mats of narrow, rich glossy green leaves. Airy sprays of fine, bead like cream beads, held on short stems all summer. Adaptable to any soil in sun or
Luzula pilosa 'Igel'	£3.95	Small tufted evergreen even for dry shade under trees. Arching tufts of broad, apple-green leaves, the tips turning reddish-burgundy as autumn progresses. Short tufts of silver white flowers during summer. Easy in any soil in sun or shade.
Luzula sylvatica 'Onderbos'	£4.20	Excellent ground cover even for dry shade. Symmetrical rosettes of narrow, arching, strap like glossy evergreen leaves with finely hairy margins. Short spikes of uninteresting brown flowers from March to June. Easy in any soil in sun or shade.
Luzula sylvatica 'Waldler'	£4.20	
Milium effusum 'Aureum'	£4.20	British native spectacular in spring with yellow stems & flowers toning to green late summer. Any reasonable soil in part
Milium effusum 'Yaffle'	£3.95	Impressixve, erect clumps of smooth, flat, ribbon-like rich golden-yellow leaves with a central silver mid-rib. Airy plumes of bead-like spikelets on gold stems in summer. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. 60x60cm.
Miscanthus nepalensis	£6.75	One of the most beautiful of all autumnal grasses, from the Himalayas & Burma. Large, arching plumes of silky, almost metallic, shining gold leaves during autumn to the frosts. Rather uninteresting, clumps of leaves with yellow autumn
Miscanthus oligostachyus 'Afrika'	£5.20	Smaller, more manageable form with erect stems having narrow, ribbon like leaves, turning spectacular coppery-rust during autumn, persisting into winter. Narrow, erect, one sided spikes of rusty red flowers during autumn. Prune hard in February. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. (8-10) 90cm.

Miscanthus sinensis 'Adagio'	£6.75	3.00	Compact form, with slender silvery-grey green leaves with a fine silver vein. Erect panicles of pale brownish pink flowers ageing silvery white during late summer & autumn. Prune hard in spring. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. (8-10) 100cm.
Miscanthus sinensis 'Andante'	£5.20		A very tall, strong growing hybrid of weeping habit. Long, ribbon like leaves with a broad silver stripe. Rather weeping panicles of fluffy silver-white plumes during autumn. Selected by Kurt Blumel. retentive soil in sun or part shade. (8-10)
Miscanthus sinensis 'Aperitiv'	£5.20		Shorter form, forming a fountain like clump of narrow leaves with a strong central silver vein. Airy, arching plumes of rose-pink plumes ageing silver, during mid to late summer. Leaves have good autumn colour. Retentive soil in sun or part shade.
Miscanthus sinensis 'Blutenwunder'	£5.20		Medium sized grass with erect stems having pale, blue-green, narrow, ribbon like leaves. gently arching plumes of silvery-pink flowers in autumn. Good autumn colour. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (8-10) 150cm.
Miscanthus sinensis condensatus 'Cabaret'	£5.50		Big, bold, strong growing grass, with broad, ribbon like leaves. They are dark green with a broad central white splash down the centre. Reddish purple flowers turn tan;- Autumn. Only flowers in hot summers. From The US national arboretum.
Miscanthus sinensis 'Federriese'	£5.20		Bred in Germany, this is a tall, narrow erect form with rather fine, grassy, ribbon like leaves, turning copper in autumn. Erectly held, narrow panicles of silvery white flowers during autumn. Prune hard in spring. Retentive soil in sun or part
Miscanthus sinensis 'Forerunner'	£5.25		Earlier flowering variety with silver-white plumes. Tall, upright stems lined with long, arching, light green, linear leaves. Provides golden autumn & winter effect. Clump-former for a retentive yet drained soil in sun. Ht: 150cms.
Miscanthus sinensis 'Gearmella'	£5.20		Stiffly erect hybrid, with narrow, upright lvs. Flowers open with a pink flush, ageing silver. Retentive yet well drained soil in sun or part shade. 120x60cm. (8-10)
Miscanthus sinensis 'Gold Bar'	£5.20	2.00	Probably the best of the gold banded grasses. Stout, erect stems with narrow, ribbon-like leaves having golden hoops, closely set together & showing better even when young. Airy plumes of one sided, silver flowers ageing buff;- autumn.
Miscanthus sinensis 'Gracillimus'	£5.20		Upright bamboo-like grass with very narrow curling grey-green leaves. Inflorescence of silvery-grey pink-flushed flowers fade silver in autumn. The whole plant bleaches straw colour in winter. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. 120x60cm.
Miscanthus sinensis 'Haiku'	£5.50		Selected by Ernst Pagels this has very fine, silver veined, long ribbon like leaves on stiffly upright stems. Fine, arching airy pink flowers from late summer through autumn. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. (8-10) Ht 180cm.
Miscanthus sinensis 'Jubilaris'	£5.50	2.00	Although this is not a very free flowering grass & is very slow to get going, it certainly adds a tropical feel to the garden. Tall stems up to 3mtrs with broad, ribbon like emerald leaves with longitudinal stripes of cream & white. Forms a large, lush clump. retentive soil in sun or part shade. (8-10) 300cm.
Miscanthus sinensis 'Kleine Silberspinne' (AGM)	£5.50		Compact, low growing cultivar with narrow deep green leaves heavily veined white. Arching panicles of very silky, silvery-white flower heads persist all winter. Good autumnal colour. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. 75x45cm.
Miscanthus sinensis 'Korea'	£5.20		Bred by Ernst Pagels, this elegant, upright form has long, narrow, ribbon like leaves, turning reddish-burgundy in autumn. Erect, rather open plumes of rusty red flowers over a long period throughout autumn. Retentive soil in sun or part

Miscanthus sinensis 'Kupferzwerg'	£5.20		Shorter form from Germany with rather fine, ribbon like leaves forming a drooping fountain. Erect, rather open, weeping heads of warm, pinkish-copper flowers, ageing silver, during autumn. A dainty form for a retentive, well drained soil in sun
Miscanthus sinensis 'Positano'	£5.20		Tall form, with broad lvs, with narrow white midribs, flushed purple-red when emerging. Leaves turn yellow-orange in autumn. Airy clusters of large, reddish-brown flowers in autumn. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. (9-11) 250cm.
Miscanthus sinensis 'Professor Richard Hansen'	£5.20		Distinct form, selected by Ernst Pagels. Mounds of fine, silver veined, ribbon like leaves. The flower spikes of rather open, bolt upright & held well above the leaves. They open reddish, quickly changing silver-white. Flowers throughout autumn. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. (8-10) 210cm.
Miscanthus sinensis 'Silberfeder' (AGM)	£5.20		Tall upright stems clothed in fluttering ribbon-like leaves. Feathery silver-pink plumes in Autumn. Moisture retentive soil.
Miscanthus sinensis 'Strictus' (AGM)	£6.75	2.00	Rather Similar To Zebrinus'. Erect Leafy Stems With Zebra-Like Stripes Of Golden-Yellow Bands. Airy Sprays Of Buff Flws Are Not As Freely Produced As In Some Hybrids. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (8-10)
