Adiantum aleuticum 'Imbricatum'	4	£4.80	Deciduous gently creeping fern, with wiry black stems carrying rounded kidney-shaped pale-green pinnate leaflets, which eventually mature green. New fronds are lightly tinged pink when young. Light, leafy retentive soil in part or full shade out of cold winds.25cm
Adiantum capillus-veneris	3	£6.20	Rare deciduous fern, a UK native with a creeping rhizome. Black wiry stems with wedge shaped, glossy pale green leaves. The new fronds in spring have a slight rosy flush. A gently creeping small fern often found naturalised in walls. Best in a retentive yet well drained soil in part shade. 15cm.
Adiantum hispidulum	4	£6.20	Very delicate, deciduous fern with wiry black stems with the fronds divided into five narrow finger shapes. The new fronds emerge a rich rosy-copper creating a superb two tone effect. From New Zealand & Australia but only hardy to -7c. In cold spots grow in a pot & put in a cold greenhouse in winter. 25cm.
Adiantum x mairisii (AGM)	3	£5.50	Possibly capillus-veneris x cuneatum. Delicate creeping maidenhair fern with almost zig zag, wiry black stems with rather smaller, rounded pinnules, soft apple green on emergence, deeper with age. Best out of cold winds in a rich, retentive soil in part or full shade. 20cm.
Adiantum venustum (AGM)	2	£5.20	(Evergreen Maidenhair Fern) Closely resembles the Maidenhair Fern with evergreen lacy, filigree fronds tinted brown when young then bluish tinged when mature. Creeping rootstock. Humus rich, moist soil in full or part shade. 20x30cms.
Arachniodes davalliaeformis	9	£6.20	Stunning Japanese fern, hardy to -10c. Semi evergreen with triangular, much divided fronds, intensely glossy & looking as they they are almost made out of plastic. can be grown in a pot & kept in a cold greenhouse in cold areas. Humus rich, retentive soil in part or full shade. 50cm.
Arachniodes simplicior	6	£6.20	Very attractive semi evergreen fern with intensely glossy green fronds held horizontally. Noticeable to the bright creamy-silver stripe down the centre. Around 2ft here but capable of double that in sheltered town gardens. Just beware of slugs who like the new growth. Rich, retentive soil in part or full shade. 60cm.
Arachniodes standishii	1	£6.20	Rarely seen evergreen fern from Korea & Japan spreading from a slow creeping rhizome & setting few spores make this very collectable. Arching fronds with closely ranked, small glossy leaflets.fully hardy in a retentive, rich soil in part or full shade. 45cm.
Araiostegia perdurans	1	£5.50	A beautiful, high altitude fern from Taiwan, still scarce in cultivation but to date has been hardy in a cold greenhouse, although it may prove fully hardy. Totally deciduous, it spreads by creeping ginger rhizomes. Delicate, very finely cut pinnate fronds are very soft & beautiful. retentive soil with some shade & shelter. 35cm.
Asplenium scolopendrium (AGM)	6	£4.80	(syn. Phyllitis scolopendrium) Easy to grow evergreen fern with smooth, leathery, strap-like leaves. Moist yet drained soil in part shade. 30x30cm.
Asplenium scolopendrium 'Angustatum'	10	£5.20	Evergreen, with crowns of strap like leathery leaves with narrow fronds deeply serrated around the edges. Humus rich, moist soil with part shade. 45x45cm.
Asplenium scolopendrium Cristatum Group	6	£4.80	(syn.Phyllitis) A lovely evergreen with smooth, leathery, strap-like leaves that divide halfway up the frond & end in a crest. Any reasonable soil in shade. 60x75cm.
Asplenium scolopendrium 'Furcatum'	3	£4.80	Short evergreen clump former with the broad leathery fronds ending in very crested tips, More So Than Cristatum'. Likes Humus & Dappled Shade But Is Quite Tolerant Of Even Dry Conditions. 45x45cm.
Asplenium trichomanes Cristatum Group	5	£5.20	Crested Maidenhair Spleenwort. Tiny, tufted evergreen fern with rosettes of wiry black stems having rounded, leathery pinnate leaflets, each ending with a small crest. Ideal for naturalising in walls. Tolerant of drier conditions when established. Part shade. 10cm.
Athyrium 'Branford Rambler'	4	£6.20	felix-femina x niponicum. Deciduous fern with lax, arching smooth green, lace fronds with a wine coloured stipe. the new growth has a pale purple flush. Excellent trailing over walls.Retentive soil in part or full shade. Bred by Nick Nickou in the 1970's but still rare. 45cm.

Athyrium filix-femina 'Lady In Lace' (AGM)	1	£6.25	Very easy, small deciduous Lady fern, looking much like a very crisped parsley. The fronds are very finely cut & look much like lace. has a rather stunted growth. Easy in any retentive soil in part or full shade. 40cm.
Athyrium filix-femina 'Minutissimum'	2	£5.80	(Lady Fern) A miniature, deciduous form of the Lady Fern. Masses of small crowns with fine, lacey, green fronds. Ideal for the front of the fern border. Prefers moist but will adapt to drier soils in part shade. 15x30cms.
Athyrium filix-femina 'Rotstiel'	1	£4.95	Graceful, light deciduous fern, with the pale yellow-green fronds delicately & lacy cut with fine pinnae. Forms a shuttlecock shape. A choice German selection. Moist, fertile, partly shaded site in anything except dry soil. 60cm.
Athyrium 'Ghost' (AGM)	7	£6.20	niponicum pictum x filix-femina. This deciduous fern was found in a US garden & is one of the most beautiful & unusual. forms a regular shuttlecock shaped rosettes of finely cut, glaucous silver fronds with just the merest tinge of pink down the central vein. Excellent for pots. Retentive, humus rich soil in part or full shade. 100cm.
Athyrium niponicum 'Godzilla'	4	£6.20	A real huge form, thought to be a niponicum x felix-femina hybrid. Looks like a huge form of the deciduous Japanese painted fern. Very long fronds are almost entirely silver with green overlay with a burgundy stain down either side of the burgundy stem. Retentive soil in part or full shade. 80cm.
Athyrium niponicum pictum (AGM)	4	£4.50	Unique in having purple stalks and fronds of grey, blue & silver hues in a lovely blend. Deciduous. Any reasonable soil in shade. 60x45cm.
Athyrium niponicum pictum 'Apple Court'	1	£6.20	Selected at Apple Court Nursery, this deciduous form of the Japanese painted fern is a subtle blend of silver, purple & green. Distinct in that the tip & leaflets are lightly crested. Gently creeping deciduous fern for a retentive, humus rich soil in part shade. 40cm.
Athyrium niponicum pictum 'Cristatoflabellatum'	5	£6.75	Attractive deciduous fern with low spreading fronds heavily marked silver & plum. The tips & edges of the fronds are randomly crested. Dislikes dry soil & needs sheltered from cold winds. 30cm.
Athyrium otophorum okanum	6	£5.20	Deciduous woodland fern with short erect fronds of thick texture. Slightly greyish leaves have a reddish midrib. Becomes very lush in a shaded moist site. 75x60cm.
Athyrium vidalii	7	£5.20	A tall, elegant fern from the Far East forming a graceful shuttlecock shape. Delicate fronds with dark stems & veins. A very elegant deciduous fern for sheltered, well drained soil in part or full shade. 75cm.
Cheilanthes lanosa	1	£4.55	Rarely seen, small evergreen fern, likely to prove difficult to cultivate. Very finely cut, grey-green, feathery segments, intensely hairy & in the wild, growing intensely arid spots where it almost shrivels in summer. Try in a dry, scree bed in sun. Ht. to 30cm.
Cyrtomium fortunei clivicola	1	£4.80	Unusual evergreen of spreading habit. More or less evergreen, holly-like fronds on dark stems. Slightly more compact than the species. Needs a moist retentive soil in sun or shade & a mulch in hard winters. 45x45cm.
Cyrtomium macrophyllum	8	£5.20	The largest of the hardy Holly Ferns, this makes symmetrical rosettes of black stalks with glossy, light green holly like fronds. More or less evergreen. Retentive or moist soil in a sheltered spot in part or full shade. 50cm.
Cyrtomium tukusicola	20	£5.80	Rarely seen evergreen fern from China, often lumped into macrophylla by botanists but now considered as species on its own. Evergreen fern with broadly pinnate, glossy green fronds. The tip is a large pinnae much like a Davidia leaf, very unusual. Needs a retentive soil in a warm, sheltered spot in part shade. 40cm.
Doodia media	1	£6.20	Small, more or less evergreen fern from New Zealand with narrow, leathery, glossy green pinnate leaves. Most striking when growing quickly as the new fronds are a rich coppery-pink. Hardy in most winters in a warm, sheltered spot in retentive soil with some shade. 25cm.

Dryopteris affinis 'Angustata Crispa'	4	£4.80	Unusual rarely seen semi evergreen fern with erectly held, very narrow, finely cut fronds, deep green held on brown haired stalks. Each of the leaflets is divided into crisped tips. Best in a retentive, rich soil in part or full shade. 60cm.
Dryopteris affinis Polydactyla Group 'Polydactyla Dadds'	1	£4.80	Rosette forming semi-evergreen with the pinnate leaves rather gappy & glossy, ending in a triple crest. They are held on dark stalks. More or less evergreen but cut off old fronds in spring. Easy in a retentive soil in part or full shade. 100cm.
Dryopteris ardechensis	1	£5.20	This is a much disputed name for this medium sized, semi-evergreen French fern. rather erectly held broadly pinnate fresh green leaves form an upright shuttlecock. Seems easy to grow in retentive soil with some shade. 60cm.
Dryopteris carthusiana	1	£5.20	Unusual deciduous delicate fern with narrow lance shaped pinnate pale green fronds with pale scales on the midribs on long stems. Retentive even moist soil in part or full shade. 90x90cm.
Dryopteris celsa	10	£5.20	Semi-evergreen to evergreen fern with rosettes of erectly held, slightly glossy leaves with narrow, finely toothed pinnae. They taper into a long, narrow point. Needs a moist even wet soil in part or full shade. 90cm.
Dryopteris championii	8	£4.80	Robust, easy to grow evergreen fern, initially found in Hong Kong but widespread over Asia. At it's best in spring when the new, thick textured fronds emerge a bright apple green. They have wide pinnae & are richly glossy dark green as they mature. One of the best for winter interest. Rich, retentive soil in part or full shade. 75cm.
Dryopteris clintoniana	8	£4.80	Semi-evergreen with bi-pinnate leathery sage green fronds up to 18ins. long. Naturally from swamps in woodland in N.E.USA. but is tolerant of much drier conditions. 60x60cm.
Dryopteris coreanomontana	1	£5.50	May be synonymous with sichotensis. Arching, rosette forming evergreen fern with finely pinnate, light green leaves, darkening a little as the fronds mature. Easily grown, hardy fern from Japan, Korea & China. Retentive soil in shade or sun. 90cm.
Dryopteris crassirhizoma	3	£4.50	Crown Wood Fern. Rosettes shaped deciduous fern from Korea, Siberia & Japan. Erectly held fronds are light green & double pinnate. Easy & undoubtedly very tough. Tolerates any reasonable soil in part or full shade. 90cm.
Dryopteris cristata	2	£4.50	Semi-evergreen, with rosettes of gappy segmented, fresh-green pinnate leaves. The fertile fronds are held erect, the sterile ones are spreading. Needs plenty of moisture or wet, not too chalky soil in part shade. 45cm.
Dryopteris dilatata 'Crispa Whiteside' (AGM)	1	£4.80	More or less evergreen clump former. Broad triangular fronds are pale green & heavily pinnate & crisp. Easily grown in a retentive soil in part or full shade. 60x60cm.
Dryopteris dilatata 'Jimmy Dyce'	1	£6.20	Discovered by Jimmy Dyce on the Isle of Arran in 1969, this more or less evergreen fern has rather erectly held frons with broad, overlapping, fine pinnae. the new growth is a fresh forest green, maturing a more glaucous blue-green & glossy as they age. Retentive soil in part or full shade. 40cm.
Dryopteris dilatata 'Lepidota Crispa Cristata'	1	£5.20	More or less evergreen fern, forming a regular shuttlecock shape. Intricately, finely cut leaves are rather lacy, crisped & variably lightly crested. A delicate, almost see-through fern. Retentive soil in part or full shade. Selected from a British native form. 60cm.
Dryopteris erythrosora 'Brilliance'	15	£5.20	A beautiful, rare, evergreen species the bold fronds warm rosy-brown when young turning glossy green later. The reverse is dotted with scarlet spores. Adaptable to any reasonable soil in full or part shade. 60x30cms.
Dryopteris erythrosora prolifera (AGM)	3	£6.20	Distinct form of this deciduous fern with the new fronds emerging a glowing pinkish-orange, ageing glossy green. Differs from the species in that the pinnae are much reduced making it much more airy. Adaptable to dry shade when established. Retentive soil in part or full shade. 60cm.

Dryopteris filix-mas 'Barnesii'	6	£5.20	Small deciduous fern with narrow arching fronds with small pinnae, serrated along the margins, giving it a crisped look. Easily grown in any retentive soil in part or full shade. 90x45cm.
Dryopteris filix-mas 'Bollandiae'	1	£15.00	Very rare in cultivation as this is a sterile evergreen fern, so can only be propagated by division. An upright, evergreen form with more delicate, finely lacy pinnae. Produces infertile spores. Found in Kent in 1857. Retentive soil in part or full shade. 90cm.
Dryopteris filix-mas 'Crispatissima'	10	£5.50	(Crinkled Male Fern) Seems to have initially been distributed by Reginald Kaye. A dwarf, congested form of our native Male Fern with rather upright, finely divided, crinkled fresh fronds. Very distinct & rare in cultivation. Tolerant of drier soils when established, but with some shade. 35cm.
Dryopteris filix-mas 'Furcans'	3	£4.80	More or less evergreen, upright fern with the fronds divided into narrow stipules, slightly glossy & forked into a small crest at each of the tips. Forms a regular shuttlecock shape. Retentive soil in part or full shade. 70cm.
Dryopteris filix-mas 'Cristata Martindale'	13	£4.80	Cristata Group. Selected form of our native Male Fern with vase shaped, usually deciduous fronds with glossy green, widely spaced pinnae with each ending a small crested tip. Makes a neat upright fern for any retentive soil in part or full shade. 60cm
Dryopteris filix-mas 'Parsley'	3	£6.20	Vigorous evergreen form of the Male Fern. Each frond has incredibly crisped & crested pinnae, resembling Parsley. More condensed than the species it has light, apple green fronds. Best in a retentive soil in part or full shade. 40cm.
Dryopteris intermedia	6	£7.50	Found in mountainous regions from Canada to Alabama. Rosettes of 60cm long, arching soft green fronds with a lacy feel. Much confused with other wood ferns. A reliable evergreen fern for a retentive soil in part shade. 50cm.
Dryopteris labordei	1	£6.20	Japanese deciduous species with triangular, rather rigid glossy green fronds. The new growth is a rich golden-orange especially when growing well. has a gently arching, open habit. Best in a retentive, humus rich soil in part or full shade. Often late to emerge in spring. 60cm.
Dryopteris lepidopoda	5	£5.20	This attractive Himalayan fern although hardy needs a very warm, sheltered spot as it's main problem is getting into growth too early in spring when it is often frosted. the new fronds are rich copper orange, becoming yellow & finally glossy green. Moist. 60cm.
Dryopteris magellanica	10	£6.50	Not sure of the validity of the name of this small evergreen fern from Southern Chile & the Falklands. Small rosettes of glossy dark green, pinnate fronds. The new growth is a light yellowish-green. A good edger for a retentive soil in part or full shade. 35cm.
Dryopteris x remota	13	£5.20	This more or less evergreen fern is a naturally occurring fertile fern, a hybrid of affinis x expansa. Rosettes of erectly held, finely pinnate, mid-green fronds with the central vein a shaggy golden-brown. easily grown in a retentive soil in part or full shade. 80cm.
Dryopteris wallichiana (AGM)	2	£5.20	Erect fronds, like a shuttlecock in spring. When young the leaves are yellow green, maturing a lustrous dark green. Dark brown scales are most noticeable in spring. Deciduous. Moist, humus-rich soil in a shaded, sheltered site. 90x90cm.
Dryopteris wallichiana ex;- Salween Valley	8	£5.20	Magnificent, deciduous upright fern, at it's best in spring when the golden scaly fronds unfurl on the black, hairy crook like stems. Always stays a light glossy golden yellow. Retentive to moist soil in part shade. A Michael Wickenden collection. 120cm.
Gymnocarpium dryopteris (AGM)	8	£4.80	(The Oak Fern) Soft golden green fronds on a creeping rootstock forming a dense mat. Give it room in a shady front of the border position. 30x60cm.
Gymnocarpium dryopteris 'Plumosum' (AGM)	10	£5.20	Deciduous fern with triangular, overlapping fronds which erupt from a creeping rootstock. likes to wander through damp humus rich soil in part shade. 20x60cm.

Hypolepis millefolium	1	£5.80	Rarely seen, small running deciduous fern with flatly held softly hairy grey-green fronds with a yellowish overlay. Creates a spreading, frothy carpet rather like Artemisia. Tolerates drier soils in sun or shade but needs a sheltered spot. 30cm.
Matteuccia orientalis	2	£6.20	Tall erect fertile fronds emerge from the centre of the rosette, with the sterile fronds around the edge, long & arching. Very graceful fern for moist yet well drained soil in dappled shade. 60x60cm.
Microlepia strigosa 'MacFaddeniae'	1	£6.20	Curious, elegant arching fern, evergreen to -7c, then proving to be deciduous. Widely spaced, wedge shaped leaves spaced all along the stems creating a light, airy feel. Best planted in a warm, sheltered spot in a retentive, humus rich soil in part or full shade. 50cm.
Onoclea sensibilis (AGM)	1	£4.45	Fully hardy, deciduous, creeping fern with handsome, arching, almost triangular fresh-green divided fronds. Often suffused pinkish-brown in spring & fading to yellow-brown in autumn. Remove old fronds regularly. Wet soil in sun or shade. 45cms.
Onoclea sensibilis copper-leaved	11	£4.80	Spreading deciduous fern with erectly held, round lobed fronds. Most striking when in growth as the new fronds emerge a rich copper-orange. Rather tolerant of drier conditions when established. Best in part shade. 30cm.
Onoclea sensibilis 'Rotstiel'	2	£5.20	Gently running deciduous fern with the new fronds emerging in spring a rich copper-red, more green by summer with just the red central stipe remaining red by autumn. Large round lobed soft green fronds. Easy in a retentive soil with some shade. 30cm.
Onychium japonicum	4	£6.25	Although on the borderlines of hardiness, the Sichuan Lace Fern forms deciduous clumps of very finely cut pinnate fronds, reminiscent of a carrot. They are held on wiry black stalks. Not always easy to please but worth every effort. Best in a retentive, warm, sheltered spot with some shade. 40cm.
Osmunda asiatica	4	£4.80	Sometimes considered to be a subspecies of cinnamomea, this graceful arching deciduous fern has broad, finely cut pale green fronds. Erect spikes of cinnamon brown fertile fronds in the centre. This fern prefers a moist or at least retentive soil in part shade. 120cm.
Osmunda cinnamomea (AGM)	2	£6.30	Spectacular large deciduous fern forming a wide shuttlecock shape. Long, daintily pinnate fresh green fronds with a rusty brown fertile spike erupting from the centre. Initially slow. Retentive or moist soil in part shade. 120cm.
Osmunda claytoniana	5	£5.20	Strong growing, upright deciduous fern, rather like the royal fern with fertile fronds covered in rusty scales emerging from the centre. The divided fronds are lightly flushed pink on the new growth. Prefers a retentive or even moist soil in sun or shade. 90cm.
Osmunda japonica	1	£5.20	Revered & eaten in Japan, this bold, spreading deciduous fern has large, horizontally held pinnate fronds with long tapering leaflets. Erect fertile fronds are covered in rusty brown spores during late summer. Humus rich, retentive soil in part or full shade. 120cm.
Osmunda regalis (AGM)	6	£4.80	(Royal Fern) The largest, most handsome, hardy fern. Uncurling leaves in Spring & are tinted coppery. Good golden Autumn foliage. Moist soil in shade. Deciduous. 90x60cm.
Phegopteris decursive-pinnata	1	£4.80	syn. Thelypteris. Gently creeping Deciduous fern from Japan, Korea & China found growing beneath beech trees. Long, narrow tapering fronds, shiny green above, more blue flushed beneath. The unfurling fronds in spring are hairy. Can tolerate drier shade when established. 45cm.
Pneumatopteris penniger	5	£9.95	Only on the borderlines of hardiness, this unusual fern from New Zealand & S.E Australia is capable of forming a small trunk. Curved, arching glossy green fronds are sparsely hairy & scaly. Found in deep, dank, dark gullies this may be a challenge. Retentive soil in shade. 175cm.
Polypodium cambricum Pulcherrimum Group 'Pulcherrimum Addison'	2	£7.50	A nice form of our native lime-loving species. The fronds are bipinnate, i.e. divided once more than normal, have quite a neat, substantial look and tend to be held quite upright. The young fronds are curved in at the edges. Very distinctive. Found on Whitbarrow, a massive lump of limestone above Morecambe Bay, in 1861. 30cm.

Polypodium glyccyrhiza 'Malahatense' (sterile)	7	£5.80	Divisions of this strange North american fern which is summer dormant, the new fronds regenerating in July & August & growing actively through winter. Low, spreading mats of long, pointed, bipinnate leathery fronds. will tolerate dry shade when established. 30cm.
Polypodium vulgare	9	£5.20	Popular evergreen fern with smooth, elongated, lance-shaped fronds which are deeply cut & look rounded on either side of the stem. Spreads via creeping rootstock. Tolerates drier soils in part shade. 45x45cms
Polypodium 'Whitley Giant'	12	£4.80	Recently re-discovered larger form sitting somewhere between vulgare x cambricum, our two native species. Spreading by underground rhizomes, this creeping evergreen has broad, horizontally held, round lobed pinnae with a glossy sheen. A little more tolerant of drier conditions. 40cm.
Polystichum x dycei	3	£5.50	proliferum x braunii. Strong growing, robust evergreen hybrid, forming a rosette of arching, finely divided, glossy green fronds. the new growth is light green. Produces bulbils at the tips, the best method of propagation. Retentive soil in part or full shade. 75cm.
Polystichum falcinellum	8	£7.50	Needing a very sheltered spot, this has rather lax rosettes of sickle shaped, pointed fronds with widely spaced, glossy green pinnae. They tend to lay almost flat to the ground. Rather untried in cultivation, best needs a retentive soil with some shade. 40cm.
Polystichum setiferum divisilobum 'Madame Patti'	5	£12.50	Rather distinct form of this evergreen fern with broad, triangular shaped fronds very finely divided in to small, angular segments, creating a very lacy effect. Small & difficult to propagate. The new fronds are light green, the older ones, glossy & dark green. Retentive soil in part or full shade. 50cm.
Polystichum mayebarae	4	£6.20	Much like a large form of tsussimense, this evergreen fern from Western China has narrowly triangular fronds that are held rather rigid in formal rosettes. Each pinnae is also triangular. More tolerant of drier shade when established. Best in a retentive soil in part or full shade. 45cm.
Polystichum munitum (AGM)	8	£5.20	Showy evergreen fern with narrow, lance shaped, leathery, pinnate, dark green fronds up to 90cms long, forming shuttlecocks. Fertile, humus rich, well drained soil in part or full shade. Remove dead fronds before new ones unfurl. 90x90cm.
Polystichum neolobatum	7	£7.50	Evergreen mountain fern from Taiwan, Japan to Nepal. Rosettes of rather thick textured, leathery, glossy green fronds, held on a dark, scaly midrib. Always sought after fern for a retentive soil in part or full shade. 35cm.
Polystichum polyblepharum (AGM)	10	£4.80	A lovely more or less evergreen fern the arching, dark green, glossy fronds have a leathery texture & are distinctly cut. They are held on long haired stalks. Any reasonable soil but likes moisture. 90x45cm.
Polystichum setiferum Congestum Group	1	£4.80	A evergreen or semi-evergreen with lance shaped soft textured & much divided spreading fronds. As they unfurl they are clothed in white scales. The fronds are tightly congested in this form. Moist rich yet well drained soil in part shade. 45 x 45cm.
Polystichum setiferum Divisilobum Group	1	£4.80	(Soft Shield Fern) In spring unfolding fronds are clothed in white scales. They grow flat to the ground with upward pointing tips. Evergreen fern for any moist soil. 75x90cm.

Thelypteris kunthii	1	£4.80	Tall form from Southern USA & C.America, but seems surprisingly hardy. Deciduous with a creeping rhizome. Rather erectly held, finely pinnate fronds, remaining a pleasing light green all season. Needs a reliable supply of moisture but tolerates sun. A real chalk lover. 100cm.

Thelypteris palustris	5	£4.25	A dainty deciduous fern with lance-shaped pale green fronds with widely separated deep cut pinnae. Has a creeping, wiry, blackish rhizome. Excellent with it's feet almost in water. Part shade or shade in moist soil.
Woodwardia fimbriata	7	£4.80	A huge fern from western USA with a creeping rhizome. The thick, leathery fronds are broadly pinnate, with round lobed rather wavy edges. In the wild the fronds are known to grow to 3m long but in cultivation are considerably less. Sheltered retentive spot.
