

Acaena affinis	£4.20		From Southern Chile, this mat forming evergreen has pinnate leaves, lightly glaucous on the topside, more so on the underside. Heads of striking red anthers in May followed by rusty red burrs. Good understorey under shrubs. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. (4-5) 10cm.
Acaena buchananii	£4.20		Creeping, evergreen mats of soft pale grey-green, toothed leaves. Small, insignificant flowers followed by spikey, red-flushed seed heads. Well drained soil in sun or part shade. 15x60cm.
Acaena magellanica	£4.20		Dense evergreen carpeter, forming mats of finely cut, fern-like soft olive-green leaves, with silver blue overtones. Heads of small white flowers in late spring are followed by showy red burrs. Excellent edger for a well drained spot in sun. (5-6) 5cm.
Acaena saccaticupula 'Blue Haze'	£4.50		(syn.A.Pewter') Vigorous creeping evergreen ground cover with long blue-grey pinnate toothed leaves flushed bronze. Showy dark red burrs in late summer. Well drained soil in sun or part shade. 10x75cm.
Acanthus dioscoridis perringii	£6.20	2.00	An elegant bear's breeches with deeply toothed, glossy leaves. Short spikes of pale-pink flowers in early summer. Needs excellent drainage in gritty, well drained soil in sun. (5-6) 60cm.
Acanthus hungaricus 'Hot Lips'	£5.50	2.00	Spikes of silvery-green bracts with dusky-purple protruding flowers, having a frilly, prominent white lower lip. Very long flowering throughout summer. Basal clumps of very finely cut, glossy green leaves. Best in a light, free draining soil in sun. (6-8) 70cm.
Acanthus hungaricus	£4.20		(syn.A.longifolius) Statuesque perennial with deeply lobed, dull green leaves. Spikes of widely spaced, mauve-pink flowers in late summer. Slow to establish then vigorous. Ordinary, fertile soil in sun or part shade. 90x60cm.
Acanthus mollis 'Hollard's Gold'	£4.95		Mounds of toothed, dark-green leaves with the new growths a burnished golden-yellow. Spikes of white flowers from purple shaded bracts on purple flushed stems in late summer. Deep, fertile well drained soil in sun or light shade. 120cm.
Acanthus mollis 'Tasmanian Angel'	£6.75		Stunning architectural plant forming mounds of jagged, glossy green leaves, frosted & mottled white. Short spikes of hooded baby-pink flowers with a white lower lip from midsummer. Needs a warm, sheltered spot out of cold winds. (7-9) 60cm.
Acanthus 'Morning's Candle'	£5.50	2.00	Selected for it's long spikes of white flowers with just a kiss of pink of the exterior, held in dark maroon-purple & jade green suffused bracts;- summer. Rosettes of spiny leaves. Well drained soil in sun. (7-8) 90cm.
Acanthus sennii	£7.80		Amazing shrubby evergreen species with woody stems & glossy, intensely spiny holly like leaves. Spikes of rich red flowers during spring & often late summer & autumn. From east Africa & proving surprisingly tough, hardy with us in a cold greenhouse so far. (3-4 & 8-10) 2.0mtrs.
Acanthus spinosus (AGM)	£5.70	2.00	Stately perennial of architectural merit. Stiff spikes of hooded soft mauve flowers with white lips; good seed heads. Rich, glossy, deeply cut leaves to 90cms. giving good ground cover. Prefers good, well drained soil in sun or light shade. 90x90cms (7-9)

Acanthus spinosus Ferguson's form	£5.20		Shorter, more free flowering clone of spinosus with the basal leaves much divided & spiny. Compact spikes of white flowers from prominent purple bracts, from July to September. Light, free draining soil in sun. (7-9) 65cm.
Acanthus spinosus spinosissimus group	£5.50	2.00	Superb foliage plant, with arching more or less evergreen finely dissected leaves. The leaves are almost cut to the veins, with are highlighted creamy-white. Less free flowering than the type. Well drained soil in sun. (6-8) 120cm.
Acanthus 'Summer Beauty'	£5.20		Chinese hybrid between spinosus x mollis giving impressive, bold rosettes of broad, glossy, slightly spiny leaves. Up to 6ft spikes of tubular white flowers, held in purple calyces throughout summer. Very strong & set to become the norm. (6-8) 180cm.

Achillea 'Alabaster'	£4.20		Dense, flattened heads pearly white flowers, opening from palest yellow buds, during early summer. Basal clumps of silver flushed, fresh green leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (5-7) 100cm.
Achillea 'Desert Eve Deep Rose'	£4.20		(Desert Eve Series) Seed strain, breeding totally true, giving much shorter plants than normal. Flattened plates of closely packed deep rose flowers with a cream eye;- June to September. Basal rosettes of feathery, finely pinnate, grey-green leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-9) 45cm.
Achillea 'Desert Eve Cream'	£4.20		(Desert Eve Series) A short series of yarrow, also bred for pots. Mounds of fresh green, finely cut leaves. Flattened heads of soft cream flowers over a good period throughout summer. Good edger for a retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-8) 45cm.
Achillea 'Desert Eve Red'	£4.20		Very short form with mounds of finely pinnate, fresh green leaves. Flattened heads of rich red-flowers with a golden-orange eye, eventually fading dull dusky-pink. Flowers midsummer. retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-8) 25cm.
Achillea 'Deser Eve Terracotta'	£4.20		(Desert Eve Series) A new strain bred also for pots. Mounds of fresh green, finely cut basal leaves. Flattened heads of warm rusty terracotta flowers with a yellow eye & fine edges to the petals, throughout summer. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-8) 45cm.
Achillea filipendulina 'Cloth Of Gold' (AGM)	£4.20		Tall, late flowering yarrow with aromatic, much divided silver-grey basal leaves. Large, flattened plates of golden-yellow flowers from midsummer into autumn. Ideal for the back of the border. more tolerant of moist soils. Well drained soil in sun is best. (7-9) 150cm.
Achillea filipendulina 'Parker's Variety' (AGM)	£4.20		Tall, back of the border variety, with large, flattened heads of rich burnished gold flowers on varying length stems during summer. basal clumps of silver-grey, deeply cut leaves. retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-8) 140cm.
Achillea 'Fornsett Bride' (Fornsett Bride)	£4.20		From the famous Norfolk nursery, this neglected hybrid has good sized heads of glistening white flowers on well branched stems ; - June to September. Creeping mats of finely cut, silver grey-green leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-9)
Achillea 'Hella Glashoff' (AGM)	£5.80	2.00	Similar to 'Credo' but shorter & paler. Flattened heads of palest cream-lemon flowers. mounds of grey pinnate leaves. Retentive well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-9) 75cm.
Achillea 'Hymne'	£4.50		syn. 'Anthem'. Popular in Europe, this offers a cool contrast to other vibrant forms. Flattened heads of soft cream flowers, initially with a green tinge, not changing as the flowers age. Creeping mats of aromatic, finely cut, silver-grey leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (5-7) 50cm.

Achillea 'Lucky Break' (AGM)	£4.50	From Great Dixter, this award winning variety is a sport of 'Taygetea' & much more growable. Flattened plates of soft creamy-lemon flowers, over mounds of very finely cut, aromatic silver leaves. Needs a more sharply drained soil than most in sun. (6-9)
Achillea millefolium 'Lansdorferglut'	£4.20	Flattened heads of deep salmon-pink flowers eventually fade rosy-white. Flowers through summer. basal rosettes of finely pinnate grey leaves. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. (5-7) 75cm
Achillea millefolium 'Lilac Beauty'	£4.20	Gently running ground cover, forming mats of finely cut, fern like, fresh green leaves. Flattened heads of small, daisy like, soft lilac-pink flowers in midsummer. Heads fade to buff with age. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (5-7) 75cm.
Achillea millefolium 'Peggy Sue'	£4.20	Shorter form with flattened heads of very intense, glowing bright marmalade orange, non fading flowers over a very long period from late spring into summer. Basal mounds of finely cut, aromatic, dark green leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-8) 40cm.
Achillea millefolium 'Pretty Woman'	£4.50	Flattened heads of the brightest reddish-pink, unfading flowers on well branched stems during midsummer. Each flowers has a small white eye. Finely cut clumps of fine green leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-8) 55cm.
Achillea millefolium 'Red Beauty'	£4.20	Attractive species with flattened heads of true-red flowers with a small yellow eye;- midsummer, held on well branched stems. Creeping mats of fern like rich green leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-7) 60cm.
Achillea millefolium 'Red Velvet'	£4.20	Flattened heads of velvet textured cherry red unfading flowers with a small white eye during summer. Basal clumps of finely cut silver green leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-9) 75cm.
Achillea millefolium 'Summer Fruits Salmon' (Summer Fruits Series)	£4.20	Strong growing mat former with finely cut, fresh green leaves. Flattened heads of warm salmon-pink flowers with a deeper eye, continually through summer. Best in a retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-9) 60cm.
Achillea millefolium 'White Queen'	£3.50	Showy form of our native milfoil with large, flattened heads of snow-white flowers over a long period during early summer. Fine mats of delicate, fresh green leaf. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (5-7)80cm.
Achillea 'Paprika'	£4.20	Upright stems topped with flat heads of DARK CHERRY-RED flowers with a small yellow eye; June to September. Basal clumps of finely-cut, ferny, aromatic, green-grey foliage. Any reasonable soil in sun. Ht: 60-90cms.
Achillea 'Petra'	£4.50	Shorter form with flattened heads of richest cherry-red flowers with a large, frosted white eye, from June to August. Basal mounds of aromatic, finely cut filigree leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-8) 40cm.
Achillea 'Pretty Belinda'	£4.50	Attractive, compact pink form with plates of flowers emerging deepest pink before changing through all shades of pink, to almost white leaving a multicoloured patchwork of colour. Fresh green, fern like leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun. (7-9)50cm.
Achillea ptarmica 'The Pearl' (clonal selection)	£4.20	This form grown at Wisley for many years is the true original clone as introduced & not the seed raised strain which has evolved today. Fully double button-like flowers & pinnate fresh green leaves on strong stems. (5-7) 60cm.
Achillea 'Saucy Seduction'	£4.20	(Seduction Series) Flattened heads of unfading, dark cherry-pink flowers with a small white eye, over a long period throughout summer. Basal clumps of aromatic, finely pinnate leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-9) 65cm.

Achillea 'Schwellenburg'	£4.20	Very showy hybrid with flattened heads of MUSTARD YELLOW in midsummer over mounds of intensely silvery broad foliage. Tolerates drier conditions than many hybrids. Retentive well drained soil in sun. 45x45cm.
Achillea 'Terracotta'	£4.20	Aptly named hybrid. Large flat heads of RICH TERRACOTTA-ORANGE flowers all summer fade to a soft yellow in autumn. Basal clumps of aromatic, evergreen, mid-green foliage. Retentive well drained soil in sun. 75 x45cm.
Achillea 'Walther Funcke'	£4.20	Upright stems topped with large, flat heads of BRIGHT ORANGE flowers; June to September. Basal clumps of aromatic, ferny, rich green foliage. Any reasonable soil in full sun. Ht: 60cms.
Aconitum anthora	£4.50	The true form, rare in cultivation. Basal mounds of much divided leaves, tinged bronze on the new growth. Lateral branches carry spikes of fat, hooded, pale yellow flowers during mid to late summer. ALL PARTS POISONOUS. Retentive soil in sun or shade 60c
Aconitum 'Blue Opal'	£5.20	Spectacular seedling found locally by John Tuite. Imposing spikes of true sky blue flowers, paler on the keels; late summer. Large, rather carmichaeli- like leaves. Retentive soil in sun or shade. (7-9)
Aconitum x cammarum 'Bicolor' (AGM)	£4.80	Erect spikes of hooded bicoloured flowers of violet & white; June-August. Glossy, deep, finger-like leaves. Retentive soil in a sunny site. 120x45cm. ALL PARTS ESPECIALLY ROOTS, ARE
Aconitum carmichaelii 'Moody Blues'	£5.65	This is one of deepest blue forms of carmichaelii we have seen. From John Tuite, this has spikes of moody, intense inky purple-blue high hooded flowers during late summer & autumn. Much divided, fleshy leaves. ALL PARTS POISONOUS. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or shade. (7-9) 100cm.
Aconitum carmichaelii 'Royal Flush'	£5.45	Shorter form of carmichaelii with the new spring leaves emerging from the ground a rich red, turning green at flowering. Dense spikes of high hooded, rich violet-blue flowers, held in branched panicles during mid to late autumn. ALL PARTS TOXIC. Retentive soil in sun or shade. (7-9) 75cm.
Aconitum carmichaelii wilsonii 'Barker's Variety'	£4.80	Good bold, back of the border variety with large spikes of hooded mid-blue flowers on thick stems. Glossy, deeply divided dark-green leaves. ALL PARTS POISONOUS. Retentive soil in sun or shade. (6-8) 150cm.
Aconitum carmichaelii wilsonii grey-blue flowered	£4.80	A seedling from 'Spatlese', with bold spikes of hooded pale grey flowers with a pearly blue flush during late summer. Basal clumps of deeply cut, dark green leaves. Retentive, humus rich soil in sun or shade. (6-8) 100cm.
Aconitum carmichaelii wilsonii 'Spatlese'	£4.85	German selection, with spikes of clear, light blue flowers, shading darker at the edges, over a long period. Clumps of deeply cut leaves, bronze tinted when young. Humus rich, retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (7-10) 120cm.
Aconitum Cloudy'	£4.80	Very subtle, erect spikes of helmet shaped, palest soft grey-blue flowers with a paler keel. Very subtle & excellent colour for midsummer. Mounds of divided basal leaves. ALL PARTS POISONOUS. Retentive soil in sun or shade. (6-8) 75cm.
Aconitum elliottii	£5.20	Rare, less robust species from Tibet & China with sparse, deeply divided leaves. Erect spikes of soft purple-blue flowers during July & August. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (7-8) 100cm.
Aconitum elwesii	£5.20	Always the first Monkshood' to flower, commencing early August. Tall spikes of hooded, DARK BLUE flowers. Seems more difficult to please in the south. Any reasonable soil in sun or shade.
Aconitum fischeri	£5.20	Thought to be a synonym for carmichaelii, this is a short species even if it is not a true one! Thick textured, glossy, divided leaves & short spikes of hooded bright blue flowers during summer. ALL PARTS POISONOUS. Retentive soil in sun/shade. (6-8) 30cm.

Aconitum fischeri arcuatum	£5.50		coll. from steep wooded hillsides at T'aebaeksan, S. Korea. Tall, rather willowy stems with deeply cut, lobed rather sparse dark-green leaves. Spikes of high hooded, deep purple-blue helmets during late summer & autumn. Cool, moist woodland soil in part
Aconitum hemsleyanum	£6.75		Scrambling deciduous climber with twining stems having divided leaves. Short, congested spikes of high hooded, mauve-blue flowers during late summer & autumn. ALL PARTS POISONOUS. Needs a cool, moist woodland soil in shade. (8-9) Th to 2.5mtrs. From C & E China.
Aconitum 'Ivorine'	£4.60		Upright spikes of hooded, tubular, IVORY-WHITE flowers; May to July. Glossy, heavily cut leaves. Grows best in retentive soil in sun or part shade. 90cms. TUBEROUS ROOTS ARE VERY
Aconitum japonicum	£4.95		Heads of hooded, LUMINOUS LAVENDER-BLUE flowers on stiff stems (though colour can be variable); over a long period late summer. Well clad in pale, divided leaves. Adapatable but prefers cool, moist, fertile soil in dappled shade. POISONOUS IF EATEN. 90x30cms.
Aconitum japonicum napiforme BSWJ943	£4.60		Dwarfer species, collected in the Odaesan region of S.Korea. Congested spikes of hooded, dusky purple-blue flowers from mid to late summer. Basal leaves are toothed & rounded. Retentive soil in sun or shade. 45x45cm.
Aconitum leucostomum	£5.50		Very distinct & unusual species from China & Russia with large, rounded, divided basal leaves. Long narrow spikes of high hooded, downward facing dusky purple flowers, in huge, well branched heads during late summer & autumn. Retentive soil in sun or shade. (8-10) 180cm. ALL PARTS POISONOUS
Aconitum lycoctonum vulparia	£4.80		(A.orientale of gardens) Branching stems of soft yellow flowers mid to late summer. Deep- green, divided leaves. ALL PARTS POISONOUS. Moist, fertile soil in sun or shade. 120cm.
Aconitum nagarum KR7589	£5.80		Short form, found by Keith Rushforth. Rather brittle in nature, it needs a sheltered spot. Much divided, very glossy, dark green leaves. Spaced spikes of individually big, dark-blue flowers during late summer. Retentive soil with some shade in a sheltered spot. (7-9) 60cm.
Aconitum napellus 'Rubellum'	£4.80		A colour break for a usually blue family. Spikes of hooded deep-pink, red flushed flowers in late summer. Mounds of deeply cut, fresh-green leaves. All parts poisonous. Retentive, humus rich soil in sun or shade. (7-9) 90cm.
Aconitum napellus 'Schneewittchen'	£4.60		Erect spikes of hooded soft-white flowers. Pale-green deeply lobed leaves. ALL PARTS POISONOUS. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or shade. (7-10) 120
Aconitum napellus vulgare 'Carneum'	£5.80	2.00	Rather an unusual hybrid, with spikes of hooded, pale dusky-pink flowers in late summer. Basal mounds of dark-green deeply cut leaves. ALL PARTS POISONOUS. Humus rich, retentive soil in sun or shade. (7-8) 120cm.
Aconitum 'Newry Blue'	£4.75		Heavily branched spikes of hooded MID-BLUE flowers; mid to late summer. Rounded, lobed dark green leaves. Retentive or moist soil in sun or shade. 120x60cm.
Aconitum piepunense	£5.80		Tall perennial species from China with open spikes of dark eyed sky blue flowers in branched spikes;- mid to late summer. Divided leaves up the stems. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or shade. (7-9) 150cm.
Aconitum seoulense	£5.20		Terminal racemes of high hooded bright blue flowers, held on bristly stems during late summer & autumn. Delicate, leaves on nearly twining stems, attaining up to 2mtrs in cultivation. A woodland species from Chollipo' S.Korea. Retentive soil in part shade. (7-9) 160cm.
Aconitum variegatum	£5.20		Spikes of hooded, bicoloured violet-blue & white flowers; late summer. Rounded, lobed, basal leaves. Moist yet well drained soil in sun or part shade. 75x45cm. Very rare in cultivation. ALL PARTS

Aconitum variegatum paniculatum	£5.20	Large panicles of violet-blue flowers on tall stems in late summer & early autumn. Glossy more rounded leaves. Retentive, rich soil in sun or shade. 120x60cm.
Aconitum volubile	£5.50	When established, this is a strong growing, twining climber. Short spikes of high hooded, soft mauve flowers during late summer & autumn. Much divided, thick textured, veined leaves. Best in a cool, moist, retentive soil in part or full shade. (8-10) Ht to 2.5mtrs.
Acorus gramineus 'Licorice'	£4.20	Small, tufted evergreen clump former with leathery, iris like, dark-green leaves smelling strongly of licorice when touched. Unusual spikes of flowers in some springs. Retentive or moist soil in sun or shade. 20x45cm.
Actaea arizonica	£5.20	was CIMICIFUGA. Rarely seen species from S.W.USA with rather lax, narrow wands of off-white flowers in late summer & early autumn. Basal clumps of toothed, deep-green, divided leaves. Retentive soil in part or full shade. (8-10) 150cm.
Actaea cordifolia	£4.25	WAS CIMICIFUGA. Much confused with racemosa & rubifolia. Clump former with mounds of deeply cut fresh green leaves. Branched stems with curved racemes of unpleasantly scented white flowers in late summer. Moist, fertile, humus rich soil in part
Actaea japonica from Cheju Do	£5.20	Very distinct form, collected by Darrell Probst. The leaves are not very deeply cut & emerge purple white silver veining, more green at flowering. Erect, candelabra like spikes of white flowers on black stems during autumn. Retentive soil in part or full shade. (8-10) 120cm.
Actaea matsumurae 'White Pearl' (AGM)	£5.30	Elegant tall perennial with mounds of fresh green, finely cut leaves. Arching, scented spikes of white bottlebrush like flowers on well branched stems during autumn. Likes good living in a rich, retentive soil in part or full shade. (8-10) 120cm
Actaea pachypoda	£4.80	Attractive plants grown chiefly for their spikes of white berries, held on thickened black stems in autumn. Clumps of much divided leaves. Small spikes of fluffy white flowers in spring. ALL PARTS POISONOUS. Cool, moist soil in part shade. (4-6) 60cm.
Actaea pachypoda Misty Blue'	£5.20	Attractive woodlander with erect stems having finely cut, ash grey leaves. Short, fluffy spikes of white flowers in May followed by spikes of white fruit, held on bright red stalks;- late summer. Best a rich, retentive, woody soil in part shade. (5-6) 75cm.
Actaea podocarpa	£4.95	syn. americana. Rarely seen species from the Eastern States, with rounded, rather gently lobed basal lvs. Long, slender racemes of creamy-white flws on unbranched stems in late summer. Retentive, humus rich soil in part shade. 180cm. (8-10)
Actaea 'Queen of Sheba'	£5.50	A shorter form with much more finely cut, dark brown-black divided leaves. Arching, very long, narrow sprays of white flowers over a long period through autumn. Best in a retentive soil with some shade at least. (8-10) 130cm.
Actaea simplex Atropurpurea Group	£5.20	(formerly Cimicifuga) Unusual hybrid with erect spikes of starry WHITE flowers with long anthers, flushed deep pink in bud & held on bronze stems;- autumn. Mounds of deeply cut, bronze purple leaves. Rich, retentive soil in sun or shade. 150cm.
Actaea simplex Atropurpurea Grp 'Brunette'	£7.40	(syn.Cimicifuga) The most spectacular hybrid. Compact wands of pink tinted, white flowers from purple buds; early & mid autumn. Basal clumps of dark purplish-bronze leaves. Moist, fertile, humus rich soil in part shade. 90x45cm.
Actaea simplex 'Carbonella' (Atrop. Grp)	£5.50	Much like a shorter form of 'Brunette' Erectly held, wand like spikes of musky white flowers, ageing with a pink flush, from August into autumn. Mounds of much, divided, rich purple-brown leaves. Retentive, even moist soil in at least part shade. (8-10) 120cm.

Actaea simplex Variegata'	£7.55	A form selected at Bressingham Gardens with cream divided leaved, heavily speckled green. Erect spikes of creamy white flowers in autumn. Surprisingly vigorous for a variegated form. Cool, moist retentive soil in part or full shade. (9-11) 120cm.
Adenophora potaninii	£4.20	Campanula relative with short spikes of widely flared violet flowers held on rather lax stems in late summer & autumn. Rosettes of toothed leaves. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. (7-9)
Adenophora stricta confusa	£4.50	(syn.A.farreri) Widely spaced, DEEP BLUISH-PURPLE bells on erect spikes; late summer. Often confused with A.bulleyana. Much like a Campanula. Ordinary soil in sun or part shade. 75x45cm.
Adenophora stricta sessilifolia	£4.80	Found growing on forest margins through Western China, this attractive, non running species has hairy reddish stems with narrow, pointed leaves. Arching stems with sprays of hanging, bell-shaped rich blue flowers throughout early summer. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (5-8) 40cm.
Adenophora takedae	£4.50	Slender, arching stems to about 60cm in length. Leaves narrowly ovate to linear, 7-15cm long, with incurved teeth. Bell shaped, long violet-blue flowers along the stems during midsummer. Light, free draining soil in sun or part shade. (5-7) 60cm.

Agapanthus 'Baby Pete'	£4.80	A real miniature with short stems carrying intermediate umbels of rich purple-blue tubular flowers. Flowers for a long period as it is sterile. Agapanthus 'Back In Black'	£5.60	Big, bold, amazing Agapanthus with rounded umbels of trumpet shaped, intense inky blue flowers, held on black stalks & stems;- late summer & autumn. Broad, strap like leaves. Needs a very sheleterd spot in sun. (7-9) 90cm.
Agapanthus 'Barnfield Blue'	£4.80	Striking form of praecox with large, rounded umbels of heads jam packed with flared, rich-blue flowers on dark stalks during late summer. Agapanthus 'Crystal Drop'	£5.20	Tall, inapertus hybrid, bred in New Zealand with nodding heads of narrowly tubular white flowers, gently suffused lilac-pink at the tips. Agapanthus 'Lavender Haze'	£5.20	Hardy, more or less evergreen, New Zealand hybrid with large, rounded umbels of trumpet-shaped, lilac flowers, held on dark stems in late summer to the frosts. Retentive, well drained soil in sun. 60x60cm.
Agapanthus 'Liam's Lilac'	£4.80	Rather hardy, deciduous variety with rounded, rather open umbels of very narrow, soft lilac flowers, stained violet at the base, held on almost black stalks during late summer & autumn. Agapanthus 'New Blue'	£5.20	Old hybrid with large, rather open umbels of mid-blue flowers with a darker central vein, held at curious angles, during midsummer. Narrow, strap like, deciduous leaves. Seems to have gone missing so a welcome re-introduction. Retentive, well drained soil in sun. (7-9) 60cm.

Agapanthus 'Peter Franklin'	£5.50	A white flowered form of praecox orientalis with stunning, rounded heads of slightly drooping pure white flowers, densely packed. Agapanthus 'Phantom'	£6.20	Huge, evergreen praecox hybrid with umbels of very large, reflexing white flowers becoming more suffused blue at the tips. Flowers late summer. slow to multiply with very broad, glossy green leaves. will need cold greenhouse protection in winter, but worth it.
Agapanthus 'Polar Ice'	£4.60	Large umbels of PURE WHITE flowers; summer. Narrow, grassy, strap-like leaves. May need a winter mulch when young. Retentive, well drained soil in sun. 75x45cm.
Agapanthus 'Purple Cloud'	£5.50	Showy heads of tubular violet-purple flowers on erect stems; mid to late summer. Strap like leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in full sun. 75x45cm.
Agapanthus 'Purple Delight'	£5.20	Broad leaves evergreen with intermediate umbels of narrowly tubular rich violet-purple flowers on dark stalks during late summer into autumn. Certainly one of the most spectacular but it's praecox breeding makes it less hardy. Sheltered, retentive, well drained soil in sun. (7-9) 90cm.

Agapanthus 'Sarah'	£5.20	One of the hardier evergreen varieties with broad, strap like leaves. Agapanthus 'Sea Spray'	£4.60	Large, rounded umbels of pale slate-white flowers, which reflects the name. Mounds of broad, evergreen strap-like leaves. Good in pots. Retentive yet well drained soil in sun or part shade. (7-8) 75cm.
Agapanthus 'Senna'	£5.20	Rounded heads of short, widely flared, dusky blue flowers stained with a deeper central vein, held on black flushed stalks & stems, during late summer & autumn. Semi-evergreen, strap like leaves. Best in a retentive, well drained soil in a sunny spot. (7-9) 90cm.
Agapanthus 'Silver Baby'	£5.20	Dwarf, very prolific variety with upright, very fine, strap like grassy leaves.
