

Calamintha ascendens	£4.20	Small, creeping species with small, highly aromatic, densely hairy grey-green leaves. Short spikes of narrowly tubular pale icy-blue flowers throughout much of the summer. Loved by insects. Rare East Anglain native. Dryish soil in sun. (5-8) 10cm.
Calamintha grandiflora 'Elfin Purple'	£4.20	Aromatic, bushy perennial the with bearing lax cymes of tubular, purple-pink flowers in summer. Ovate, toothed, green leaves. Thrives in dappled shade in a retentive yet drained, humus-rich soil. To: 45x45cms
Calamintha nepeta glandulosa 'White Cloud'	£4.20	Small deciduous edging perennial with woody stems carrying highly aromatic, mint scented small hairy leaves. Narrow, airy spikes of small, two lipped tiny white flowers over a long period in summer, much loved by insects & bees. Light, free draining soil in sun. (5-9) 30cm,
Calamintha nepeta 'Weisse Riese'	£4.20	syn. 'White Giant'. German selection of our familiar native. Erect stems with highly aromatic, rounded, yellowish-green leaves. Tall, airy spikes of two-lipped white flowers which are much loved by bees, from midsummer to September. Best in a light, free draining soil in sun. (7-9) 40cm.
Calamintha sylvatica 'Menthe'	£4.20	New European hybrid, with woody stemms carrying small, grey-green aromatic leaves. Long spikes of surprisingly large white flowers are freely produced all summer. Loved by bees. Wel, drained soil in a sunny site. (5-9) 30cm.
Calanthe discolor	£11.95	A semi evergreen orchid suitable for the woodland garden. Large pairs of pleated & folded soft green leaves are topped by spikes of purple brown flowers with rose pink lips in summer. Humus rich woodland soil in a sheltered position. 45x30cm.
Calanthe nipponica	£10.95	
Calanthe striata	£11.50	On the borderlines of hardiness, this terrestrial orchid has pairs of pleated, pale looking leaves. Rather exotic, citrus scented spidery yellow flowers during late summer. Needs a woodland soil with some shade & possibly best in a cold greenhouse in cold winters. (7-9) 45cm.
Callirhoe involucrata tenuissima	£5.20	coll. 7,000' elevation in Los Lirios, Coahuila State, Mexico. Low, prostrate, mat forming semi evergreen with radiating stems clothed in mallow-shaped, deeply cut leaves. Large, silky, cup-shaped lavender-pink flowers with white edges & eye, early to midsummer. Needs excellent drainage in sun. (5-7) 20cm.
Caltha leptosepala	£4.50	Heart-shaped, glossy, dark-green leaves with large, silvery-white stemless flowers with a yellow eye in the crown. flowers spring. From northern N.America. Rich, moist boggy soil in full sun. (4-5) 30cm.
Caltha leptosepala howellii	£4.50	Rarely seen USnative for a moist or even wet soil. Rosettes of rather Eryngium planum like leaves. Short stems carry clusters of narrow, rather ragged petalled white flowers in early to mid spring. Can be grown as a marginal in water up to 3-4' deep. Slow to multiply. (3-4) 20cm.
Caltha palustris (AGM)	£4.35	Familiar native waterside plant with sprays of shiny, golden-yellow flowers in spring. Rich, very moist soil in sun or part shade. 30x30cms. Flowers: April-May
Caltha palustris alba	£4.20	Familiar native waterside plant with sprays of shiny, white flowers in spring. Rich, very moist soil in sun or part shade. 30x30cms. Flowers: April-May
Caltha palustris 'Himalayan Snow'	£4.80	Selected from a Himalayan form which is taller & bolder than the form in cultivation. Dark flushed stems with white flowers having broad, overlapping petals & flushed pink on the reverses. Large, glossy green, scallop shaped leaves/ Retentive, even wet soil in sun or shade. (3-5) 40cm.

<i>Caltha polypetala</i>	£4.20		The true form, which is much shorter & compact than the form usually in cultivation. Basal rosettes of glossy, rounded deep-green leaves & clusters of cup-shaped rich golden yellow waxy flowers in late spring. Retentive or moist soil in sun or pt.sh. (4-6) 30cm
<i>Caltha scaposa</i>	£4.80		One of the smallest species from W.China & the Himalayas, with tiny rosettes of rounded, dark-green leaves. Clusters of cup-shaped, golden yellow flowers in late spring with the stems extending when in seed. Retentive or moist soil in sun or part
<i>Camassia</i> 'Blue Candle'	£4.50		Strong growing, bold hybrid with long, densely packed spikes of iridescent sky-blue starry flowers during early early summer. Fleshy, broad green, strap like leaves. Ideal but slow coloniser. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (5-6) 90cm.
<i>Camassia</i> 'Blue Heaven'	£4.50		Possibly has some <i>cusickii</i> in it. Bold spikes of narrow, spidery petalled mid-blue flowers with purple overtones in late spring & early summer. Pleated, sword like leaves. Excellent for naturalising in grass. Moist, fertile yet well drained soil in sun or part shade. (4-
<i>Camassia cusickii</i>	£4.35		Choice bulbous plant from Oregon with wide strap-like greyish leaves, green beneath & wavy margined. Loose spikes of starry, pale blue flowers with one folded back petal; late spring. Retentive well drained soil in sun or part shade. 60x30cms. BULBS
<i>Camassia leichtlinii leichtlinii</i> (AGM)	£5.65	2.00	Tall spikes of starry creamy-white flowers opening slowly from the base; late spring. Clumps of narrow grassy leaves emerge from a bulb. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. 90x30cm. BULBS POISONOUS.
<i>Camassia leichtlinii</i> 'Sacajawea'	£4.50		The first variegated <i>leichtlinii</i> type with broadly striped creamy-white leaves. Tall spikes of starry white flowers in May & June. Bulbous perennial for retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (5-6) 75cm.
<i>Camassia leichtlinii</i> 'Semiplena'	£4.35		Spikes of semi-double, CREAMY-WHITE flowers in late spring after which the leaves become spiralled & finally dormant in late summer. Choice, & rarely seen bulbous perennial. Retentive, rich, yet well drained soil in sun or part shade. BULBS POISONOUS
<i>Camassia quamash</i>	£4.20		syn. <i>esculenta</i> . A good bulbous plant for naturalizing. Erect stems carry spires of blue, starry flowers; May & June. Forms a cluster of small, grassy leaves. BULBS POISONOUS. Fertile soil in sun or part shade. 90x20cms.
<i>Camassia quamash</i> 'Blue Melody'	£4.50		A new hybrid with narrow, grassy leaves regularly variegated cream. Starry, RICH BLUE flowers held in loose spikes on erect stems; late spring. Petals become twisted on fading. Retentive well drained soil in sun or part shade. 60x30cm. BULBS POISONOUS.
<i>Camassia quamash</i> 'Orion'	£4.20		Dense erect panicles of closely packed steely dark blue flowers from deep purple buds; late spring & early summer. Claspig glaucous leaves. Dormant by late summer. Retentive well drained soil in sun or part shade. 60x45cm. BULBS POISONOUS.
<i>Campanula</i> 'Albert Kirkham'	£5.20		Unidentified wild collected species, much like <i>glomerata</i> or <i>moesiaca</i> but soundly perennial. Forms creeping mats of oval leaves topped by clusters of upward facing, narrow lilac-pink flowers with almost closed mouths, during late spring & early summer. Needs a species name really. Free draining soil in sun or part shade. (4-6) 35cm.
<i>Campanula alliariifolia</i>	£4.50		(syn. <i>C.a.White Bells'</i> ) Long, wiry stems lined with IVORY-WHITE NODDING BELLS; summer. A beautiful bell-flower forming basal clumps of greyish, heart shaped leaves. Reasonably drained soil in sun or shade. 90cms.
<i>Campanula barbata</i>	£4.20		Delicate spikes of drooping, PALE MILKY-BLUE, bell-shaped flowers with long white hairs in the throat; early summer. Good for the front of the border. Well drained soil for sun or part shade. 30x30cm.

Campanula 'Chloe'	£4.80	Small, edging upright perennial with well branched stems carrying good sized, long, narrowly tubular mauve-blue flowers over a long period from midsummer. Much like a small 'Sarastro'. Nettle like leaves. Light, free draining soil in sun. (6-8) 20cm.
Campanula glomerata	£4.20	Dense terminal heads of tubular, deep-blue flowers. stiff stems, with rounded slightly toothed leaves. Colour can be variable in wild collected seed. Cut back hard after flowering for a second flush. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (6-7) 40cm.
Campanula glomerata 'Caroline'	£4.50	A new colour break for this reliable border perennial. Dense, rounded clusters of LILAC-PINK bell-shaped flowers; freely produced all summer. Spreading rosettes of basal leaves. Fertile, well drained soil in sun or shade. 60x60cm.
Campanula glomerata dahurica	£5.80	Distinct from our native form with it's long, elongated heads of starry, rich violet-purple flowers during May & June. Creeping, basal rosettes of red tinged leaves. Easy & long lived in a light, free draining soil in sun or part shade. (5-7) 50cm.
Campanula glomerata 'Emerald'	£4.50	Good sized, rounded heads of pale-blue flowers with a dark blue edge & reverse during late spring & early summer. The pointed new leaves emerge emerald green. Light, free draining soil in sun or light shade. (5-7) 40cm.
Campanula glomerata 'Genti Twisterbell'	£4.80	Rather distinct form of the Clustered bellflower. When in bud the petals are curiously white twisted & hairy. Heads of tubular violet-blue, bellshaped flowers emerge in late spring, through summer with a distinct white throat. Basal rosettes of coarse leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun. (5-8) 55cm.
Campanula glomerata 'Joan Elliott'	£4.50	Large clustered heads of bell-shaped RICH-VIOLET flowers in early summer. Very showy hybrid of this popular, front of border perennial. Spreads gently. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. 45x45cm.
Campanula grossekii	£4.50	A very unusual variety with jagged leaves. Upright stems carry spires of smokey- blue saucers. Sun or part shade in any fertile well drained soil. 90x60cm. (6-8)
Campanula 'Indigo Blue'	£7.60	Ringsabell Series'. A really dwarf form of the Korean bellflower with mats of pointed, toothed leaves. Very large, hanging, widely tubular inky violet-blue flowers from late spring to early summer. Much like a very short 'Sarastro'. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (5-8) 45cm.
Campanula 'Iridescent Bells'	£4.80	Bushy, medium sized perennial, almost continuously in flower. Widely flared, bell shaped violet buds open to silky, soft lavender flowers throughout summer. Toothed leaves reminiscent of punctata. Light, free draining soil in sun or light shade. (5-9) 75cm.
Campanula 'Kent Belle' (AGM)	£4.50	Vigorous hybrid of bushy, erect habit. Spikes of large, bell-shaped, LUSTROUS VIOLET-BLUE flowers. May need staking in exposed sites. Drained, retentive soil in sun or part shade. 100x60cms. Flowers: July-September.
Campanula lactiflora	£4.20	Sately perennial the stout, leafy stems crowned with great branching heads of LIGHT POWDER-BLUE, bell-shaped flowers; June to August. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. 130x60cms.

Campanula lactiflora 'Avalanche'	£4.50	Tall, upright, clump forming bellflower with erect stems having hairy, light green leaves. Large heads of widely bell-shaped white flowers from slatey bud during mid to late summer. light, free draining soil in sun or light shade. (6-8) 120cm.
Campanula lactiflora 'Border Blues'	£4.50	Maybe a touch darker than 'Pritchard's Variety' this has large pyramidal inflorescences of mid-blue flowers with slightly recurving petals, thus showing the white eye ; - July & August. Good clump former for a well drained soil in sun. (6-8) 120cm.
Campanula lactiflora 'Pritchard's Variety' (AGM)	£4.50	Fine hardy perennial with stout stems carrying branching heads full of VIOLET-BLUE bell-flowers; May-August. May need staking if exposed. Any reasonable soil in sun or shade. 120x60cms.
Campanula lactiflora 'Gloaming'	£4.50	Very rarely seen hybrid as it is very slow to multiply. Bold spikes of upward facing, jagged, bell-shaped, soft smokey-blue flowers during mid to late summer. A rare chance to obtain this sought after plant. Well drained soil in sun or light shade. (6-9) 70cm.
Campanula lactiflora 'White Pouffe'	£4.20	Long lasting display of branching heads of WHITE BELL-FLOWERS on hummocks of stiff stems. Adaptable plant for sun or part shade. 25cms. Flowers: June-September.
Campanula latifolia alba	£4.20	Vigorous upright perennial, with stout unbranched stems carrying spikes of broad, tubular white flowers with widely flared lobes, held in the upper leaf axils. Whorls of pointed toothed leaves. Well drained soil in sun or light shade. (6-8) 120cm.
Campanula latifolia 'Brantwood'	£5.20	Spires of tubular, RICH VIOLET-BLUE flowers. Good clump former with rounded basal leaves. Spreads freely. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. 100x60cm. Flowers: June-September
Campanula latifolia macrantha	£4.60	Tall, bold, distinguished border plant with SPIKES OF LARGE VIOLET-BLUE BELLS followed by unusual seed heads. Self seeds when happy. Ordinary soil in sun or part shade. 120x60cms. Flowers: June-July.
Campanula latifolia macrantha 'Alba'	£4.50	Stiff, strong, erect stems studded up their entire length with wide, saucer-shaped, PURE WHITE flowers; June & July. Outstanding evergreen with rosettes of handsome, green leaves. Ordinary soil in sun or part shade. 75x60cm.
Campanula latiloba 'Hidcote Amethyst' (AGM)	£4.80	Stiff stems clothed in wide, cup-shaped, LIGHT LILAC-PINK flowers; May to August.. Handsome, ground hugging, evergreen rosettes. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. 90x45cms.
Campanula latiloba 'Highcliffe Variety' (AGM)	£4.80	Noted evergreen variety with erect stems studded with DEEP BLUE BELLS; all summer. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. 90cms.
Campanula latiloba 'Percy Piper' (AGM)	£4.50	Evergreen rosettes topped with stiff, straight stems studded with wide, large, cup-shaped RICH BLUE flowers. Fertile, moist yet drained soil in sun or very light shade. 90cms. Flowers: June-
Campanula latiloba 'Splash'	£4.80	Spikes of widely flared, cup-shaped soft-blue flowers with irregular patches of deeper blue, randomly splashed. Rosettes of more or less evergreen, narrow leaves. Well drained soil in sun or light shade. (6-8) 90cm.
Campanula makaschvilii	£4.35	Much like a small C.alliarifolia, but smaller in all parts. Branching stems with heart shaped toothed grey hairy basal leaves & one sided spikes of creamy white bell shaped flowers in late summer. Fertile well drained soil in sun or part shade. 30x45cm.
Campanula makaschvilii 'Rosea'	£4.80	Small, gently creeping Caucasian species with hairy, heart-shaped leaves. Arching spikes of with bell-shaped dusky pink flowers with flared lips during early to midsummer. A good edger for well drained soil in sun. (5-8) 30cm.
Campanula Mevr. V. Vollenhove'	£4.35	
Campanula ochroleuca	£4.50	Spikes of creamy-white bell-shaped flowers with extended stamens; late summer. Attractive perennial much like C.alliarifolia with heart-shaped grey-green leaves. Ordinary soil in sun or part shade. 75x45cm.

Campanula persicifolia	£4.20	Slender stems lined with cup-shaped LILAC-BLUE flowers; June to August. Attractive basal rosettes of evergreen leaves. Any well drained soil in sun or part shade. 90cms.
Campanula persicifolia 'Azure Beauty'	£4.50	Not sure if this a latiloba or persicifolia or possibly a hybrid of the two. Spikes of very large, rich blue hose-in-hose flowers with one cup sitting inside the other;- May & June. semi evergreen rosettes of leaves. Free draining soil in sun or light shade. 90cm.
Campanula persicifolia 'Cornish Mist'	£4.35	Discovered in a Cornish Garden, this has spikes of bell-shaped, soft lavender-grey flowers over a long period from early to mid summer. Basal rosettes of narrow, evergreen leaves. Divide regularly for vigour. Well drained soil in sun. (6-7) 90cm.
Campanula persicifolia 'La Bello'	£4.50	Slightly shorter than the species this double flowered form has been bred to be resistant to rust. Spikes of double light violet-blue flowers almost hose in hose during midsummer. Divide regularly for vigour. well drained soil in sun. (6-7) 60cm.
Campanula persicifolia 'La Bonne Amie'	£4.80	Spikes of double, almost hose-in-hose, pure white flowers with reflexed tips to the petals;- early summer. Basal, evergreen rosettes of leaves need dividing regularly for vigour. Well drained soil in sun. (5-7) 70cm.
Campanula persicifolia 'Powder Puff'	£4.50	Good, rust resistant variety with spikes of fully double, almost rose-like, pristine white flowers over a long period in early summer. Evergreen, basal rosettes of narrow green leaves. Light, well drained soil in sun. (5-7) 60cm.
Campanula persicifolia 'Takion Blue'	£4.20	More compact, free branching and free flowering than the norm for this group. Upright stems are lined with bell-shaped, blue flowers to 4cms across in May & June. Attractive fresh green foliage. Fertile soil in sun or part shade. Ht: to 60cms
Campanula 'Pink Octopus'	£4.50	Very unusual Campanula with each flower composed of four, very long, spidery, rich pink petals which reflex with age;- midsummer. Basal rosettes of very glossy, toothed, dark green, red edged leaves. Free draining soil in sun. (6-7) 50cm.
Campanula portenschlagiana (AGM)	£6.75	Gently spreading ground cover for the rockery or edge of the border. Heavy clusters of narrowly bell shaped, purple-blue flowers over a long period in early summer. Scallop shaped, toothed leaves. Well drained soil in sun or light shade. (5-7) 10x40cm.
Campanula portenschlagiana 'Catharina'	£4.20	Compact ground covering bellflowers with thimble sized rich purple blue flowers on dark flushed stems;- late spring through summer. Ideal edger or for rockery. Light, free draining soil in sun. (5-7) 15x45cm.
Campanula punctata howozawa	£4.20	Although this name is not found in literature, it does represent a distinct subspecies of this widespread species. Creeping mats of purple flushed, toothed leaves. Short stems carry large, bell-shaped soft dusky-pink flowers with flared mouths, during early summer. well drained soil in sun. (5-7) 30cm.
Campanula punctata 'Pantaloons'	£4.50	Gently running ground cover, forming patches of bronze flushed, nettle-like leaves. Large, double, lavender-pink, bell-shaped flowers, spotted per pink inside in summer. Well drained soil in sun or light shade. (6-8) 35cm.

Campanula punctata 'Silver Bells'	£4.50	Very early flowering Campanula with rosettes of beetroot stained leaves with a metallic sheen. Large, nodding blush pink flowers stained deeper on the exterior, held on red stems;- April to July. Best in a light, free draining soil in sun. (4-8) 35cm.
Campanula punctata 'Wedding Bells'	£4.50	Spikes of very large double white flowers, flushed pink on the exterior, with a hairy throat. Creeping mats of pointed, toothed leaves. Well drained soil in sun or light shade. (7-9) 50cm.
Campanula pyramidalis	£4.20	Spikes of large, MID-BLUE flowers over a long period; summer. Large, heart-shaped leaves. Can be short lived but in a light, well drained soil is souldly perennial. 150x60cms.
Campanula pyramidalis 'Alba'	£4.20	The beautiful WHITE form the stiff stems clothed in huge, bell-shaped flowers. Statuesque perennial with large, heart-shaped basal leaves form a pyramid of foliage. Light well drained soil in sun. 150x60cm.
Campanula rotundifolia 'Olympica'	£4.20	Familiar Scottish native with wiry stems carrying cup shaped rich-blue thimble like flowers with a white throat, from early to midsummer. They emerge from dark blue buds. Tiny, elliptic glossy leaves. Light, free draining soil in sun or light shade. (5-7) 30cm.
Campanula rotundifolia 'White Gem'	£4.20	Rarely seen white form of our native harebell. Slender stems & nodding white bells over finely toothed fresh green leaves; summer. Well drained soil in sun or part shade. 20x30cm.
Campanula 'Royal Wave'	£4.50	Amazing small edger with a very strong scent. the mound is studded in upward facing rich violet blue flowers with a dark ring around a white eye. Flowers all summer as it is sterile. Light free draining soil in sun. (5-9) 20x30cm.
Campanula 'Sarastro'	£4.50	A new Austrian hybrid very much like C.Kent Belle' but much more compact. Large, bell-shaped, deep violet blue flowers on branched stems. Clumps of jagged leaves. Well drained soil in sun or part shade. 45x45cm.
Campanula sarmatica	£4.35	Choice clump-forming perennial from the Caucasus. Triangular, heart-shaped, woolly grey leaves. Spikes of hairy, bell-shaped, LIGHT GREY flowers; late spring into midsummer. Ordinary soil in sun or part shade. 45x45cm.
Campanula speciosa	£4.50	Like a dwarf Canterbury Bell. Erect, bristly spikes of bell-shaped MID-BLUE flowers; all summer. Usually monocarpic. Gritty, well drained soil in full sun. 45x45cm.
Campanula 'Spring Bell'	£4.20	Very hardy, bun forming perennial, smothered in a mass of upward facing electric blue bells, suffused white in the throat, continuously from April to September. Small, rounded, scallop-shaped leaves. Best in a light, free draining soil in sun. Ideal for a pot. (4-9) 15cm.
Campanula thyrsoides	£4.50	A spectacular, much sought after, but unfortunately only biennial bellflower. Rosettes of pointed leaves from which arises a spike of tubby, bell-shaped, creamy-yellow flowers with wispy bracts throughout summer. Well drained soil in sun. (6-8) 45cm.
Campanula trachelium	£4.20	Stout, sometimes red stems, carry shortish spikes of mid-blue to lilac, outward facing, bell-flowers held on short stalks; June-August. Upright perennial with nettle-like leaves. Grows in sun or shade in any fertile well drained soil. 90x45cms.

Campanula trachelium alba	£4.50	Tall, elegant, narrow spikes of flared, tubular, slightly hairy, WHITE bells; summer. Basal clumps of bristly, nettle-shaped, dark green leaves. Good rich soil in sun or part shade. 75x45cm.
Canna 'America'	£6.25	Heads of unusual, crimson flushed deep-red flowers. Large, fleshy, paddle-shaped deep bronze-brown leaves. Good architectural plants for late summer bedding. Protect rhizomes from frost. (8-11)
Cardamine digitata	£4.50	Rare species from Eastern USA with heads of simple, four petalled widely trumpet shaped, soft pink purple flowers as the leaves emerge in spring. The push through the ground with a bronze tinge & are finely pinnate. Cool, moist, woodland soil in part shade. (3-4)35cm
Cardamine diphylla	£4.35	A joy from the spring woods of N.America, with a creeping, scaly rhizome giving rise to lobed, divided fresh-green leaves. Umbels of large, cup-shaped white flowers with the new growth in early spring. Leafy, woodland soil in part or full shade. (3-5) 20cm.
Cardamine diphylla 'Eco Cut Leaf'	£4.25	Delicate spring woodlander forming loose, informal mats of deeply divided fresh green leaves. Small clusters of simple four petalled white flowers just above the leaves in mid spring. Dormant through summer. Cool, humus rich soil with at least some shade.15cm
Cardamine enneaphylla	£4.80	Nodding racemes of pale creamy yellow flowers; late spring & early summer. Deciduous spreading clumps of deeply toothed & divided leaves. Retentive soil in part or full shade. 30x45cm.
Cardamine glanduligera	£4.50	Unusual species with much divided, toothed leaves emerging with the purple-pink flowers in nearly spring. Dies down quickly after flowering. Leafy, woodland soil rich in humus in part or full shade. (3-4) 25cm. E.Europe.
Cardamine heptaphylla	£4.50	Wiry stems topped with WHITE cuckoo-like' flowers. Tubers give rise to large, finely cut, glossy green leaves An attractive plant for shady, woodland conditions. Not too dry soil in part or full shade. 45x45cm. Flowers: March to April.
Cardamine heptaphylla 'Big White'	£4.80	Taller, stronger growing variety of this spring woodlander with stems topped by divided glossy green leaves. Domed heads of simple, four petalled crisp white flowers in late spring. Often dormant by summer. Best in a retentive yet well drained woodland soil with some shade. (4-5) 50cm.

Crocoshmia 'Ellenbank Firecrest'	£4.50		From Scotland, this distinctive hybrid has narrowly tubular reddish-orange flowerers with the inside almost entirely buttercup-yellowm, held in arching heads;- mid to late summer. Plaested leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (7-8) 60cm.

Crocasmia 'Firefly'	£4.50	Shorter form with almost unmarked, intense glowing scarlet-red flowers on dark, arching stems from mid to late summer. erect fans of leathery, sword like leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (7-8) 45cm.
Crocasmia 'Fire King'	£4.50	What we have here is not Jackanapes' (misapplied). Arching spikes of large, bright scarlet red flowers which unusually face upward. Vigorous fans of broad, dark-green leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun. (7-8) 90cm.
Crocasmia 'Golden Ballerina'	£4.50	One of the most distinct form available with huge, reflexing, erythronium like, rich golden yellow flowers from bright orange buds;- late summer. Fine, ribbed, pale green leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun. (7-9) 90cm.
Crocasmia 'Harmonia'	£4.50	A very rare hybrid selected by Dave Fenwick. Erect fans of pleated leaves. Short sprays of very rich tomato-red flowers with a tiny yellow throat;- mid to later summer. Slow to multiply. Initially thought to be 'Vulcan' it has now been named after his sister. Well drained soil in a sunny, sheltered spot. (7-8) 75cm.
Crocasmia 'Hellfire'	£4.50	An improved form of 'Lucifer' with erect fans of pleated leaves. Arching sprays of richest red flowers without any yellow markings during late summer. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (7-8) 120cm.
Crocasmia 'Jupiter'	£4.50	A good framework of upright, lance-shaped leaves topped with arching sprays of YELLOW-ORANGE flowers. Retentive soil in sun/part shade. 60cms. Flowers: July-August.
Crocasmia 'Karin'	£4.50	Said to be a bright red, but so new to the market that i have no more description other than that it is earlier flowering than 'Lucifer'. Flowers July to September. retentive, well drained soil in sun. (7-9)
Crocasmia 'Lady Ann'	£4.50	Two ranked spikes of arching, narrowly tubular, glowing orange flowers with a ruby red ring around a gold throat, from mid to late summer. They are held on dark stems. Fans of upright, sword like leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-8)

Crocasmia 'Limpopo'	£4.35	Good sized, warm salmon-orange flowers with pink overtones during late summer. Apricot throat. Upright fans of sword like leaves. Light, well drained soil in sun. (6-8)90cm.
Crocasmia 'Lucifer' (AGM)	£4.50	Arching sprays of STUNNING FLAME-RED flowers on wiry stems; August-October. Clump forming cormous perennial with soft, sword like leaves. Humus-rich, moist yet drained soils in sun or part shade. 120x30cms.
Crocasmia masoniorum 'African Dawn'	£4.50	Bred initially as a cut flower, this has spaced, arching spikes of rich golden yellow flowers from July to September. fans of upright, lightly pleated leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (7-9) 90cm.
Crocasmia masoniorum 'Firebird'	£4.50	Striking form with arching sprays of intense glowing orange scarlet flowers with a small gold throat;- July & August. Upright fans of sword like, lightly pleated leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun. (7-8) 90cm.
Crocasmia 'Ministar'	£4.80	Rather attractive form with alternate petals light & dark orange. The whole inside is a rich gold. They are held on dark brown-purple stems from mid to late summer. Erect fans of narrow, leathery green, sword like leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (7-9) 60cm.
Crocasmia 'Mistral'	£4.20	Arching spikes of small, narrow trumpet-shaped deepest red flowers, one of the darkest cultivars available. Fans of narrow, sword-like pale-green leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (7-8) 75cm.
Crocasmia paniculata 'Cally Greyleaf'	£5.20	Very distinct form with rather large, fat, pleated glaucous grey leaves. Very long spikes of narrowly tubular orange flowers, held in two ranks on purple stems, during late summer & autumn. Needs space. Sheltered, well drained spot in sun. (7-9) 120cm.

Crocoshmia 'Paul's Best Yellow'	£4.50	Quite outstanding introduction with large spikes of individually very large rich golden-yellow flowers. the whole head is open at the same time making it more impressive. Fans of narrow leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. 90cm.
Crocoshmia pottsii 'Culzean Pink'	£5.75	A rarely seen hybrid with unusual peach-orange flowers, fading pink at the throat. Dark flushed stems. Fans of narrow, upright leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in a sunny sheltered site. (7-8)
Crocoshmia pottsii 'Princess'	£4.50	Tall, upright perennial with distinct, broad, pleated dark green leaves. Arching spikes of flared tomato-red flowers with a tiny gold throat, speckled purple. Flowers mid to late summer. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (7-9) 90cm.
Crocoshmia 'Prince of Orange'	£4.80	Arching spikes of widely flared, intense glowing orange flowers with a bright gold eye. Has a ring of rich burgundy markings in the throat. Contrasting cream stamens. Erect fans of fresh-green, sword-like leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade.
Crocoshmia 'Scarlatti'	£4.50	Arching, one sided spikes of widely flared, rich scarlet-red flowers during mid to late summer. Conspicuous yellow stamens. They are held well clear of the sword like leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (7-9) 75cm.
Crocoshmia 'Sulphurea'	£5.75	2.00 Arching spikes of tubular pale SULPHUR- YELLOW flowers in late summer. Fans of fresh green narrow leaves. Retentive well drained soil in sun or part shade. 90x45cm.
Crocoshmia 'Sunglow'	£4.50	Rather distinct, golden-yellow form with two distinct ranks of arching, narrowly tubular flowers, emerging from dark orange buds, during mid to late summer. Dark brown stems & fans of narrow, sword like leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade.
Crocoshmia 'Suzanna'	£4.80	Very distinct yellow form with rather erect spikes of two ranked, narrow golden-yellow flowers during late summer. The sword like leaves have good rust resistance. Very distinct huge corms. Retentive, well drained soil in a sunny, sheltered spot. (7-9) 75cm.
Crocoshmia 'Walberton Red'	£4.80	Much like an improved 'Lucifer' with arching spikes of flared, glowing tomato-red flowers with just the tiniest gold throat. They are held on purple flushed stems during mid to late summer. Erect fans of broad, pleated, sword-like leaves. well drained soil in sun or light shade. (7-9) 90cm.
Cryptotaenia japonica atropurpurea	£4.20	Beautiful foliage plant with ebony, upright stems & trifoliate, beetroot-brown, smokey leaves. Sprays of small pink flowers intermittently through the season. Ordinary not too dry soil in sun or shade. 45x45cm.
Cynanchum ascyrifolium	£4.50	Asclepias relative, closely related to Vincetoxicum. Erect stems with elliptic, deeply veined leaves. Open heads of five petalled white flowers with a small yellow eye;- Early summer. Easy in any well drained soil in sun or part shade. (5-7) 70cm.
Cynara cardunculus 'Cardy'	£4.80	A large flowered form, bred specifically for the cut flower trade. large evergreen mounds of intensely silver haired, jagged leaves. Bold stems carry large violet-blue flowers in a big calyx throughout summer. Free draining soil in sun. (6-9) 150cm.
Cynoglossum nervosum	£4.50	Sprays of intense blue, small, forget-me-not flowers on branching stems; early summer. Mats of narrow, grey-green leaves. Any reasonable soil in sun but the stems will flop if overfed. 60x60cm.
Cypripedium reginae	£13.70	North American species with large, pouch like, white flowers with a prominent pink lower lip during early summer. Stem clasping, deepy veined leaves. Cool, moist, woodland, well drained soil. For the skilled grower. (6-7)40cm

Cypripedium tibeticum	£13.95	Tiny, hardy, slipper orchid from SW China to Yunnan over to Sikkim & Bhutan. Short stems with soft-green, downy, deeply veined leaves. The flower is a violet-purple pouch with striped petals, during early summer. They really need skill to grow so please ask. (5-6) 20cm.
Cyrtanthus mackenii 'Himalayan Pink'	£4.35	Small, bulbous perennial with heads of trumpet-shaped, soft-pink, waxy flowers, sweetly scented & held in spring. More or less evergreen, narrow, strap like leaves. Only hardy in the most sheltered of spots in sun. best in a cold greenhouse. 30cm.
Cyrtanthus mackenii red flowered	£4.35	Small, more or less evergreen, bulbous perennial from S.Africa with heads of starry, cup-shaped, soft-red flowers in late spring. Sweetly fragrant. Narrow, strap like leaves. Not reliably hardy on the rockery, best in a cold green house. Sun. (3-4) 30cm.
