

Gaillardia 'Dazzler' (AGM)	£4.20		Striking heads of BRIGHT ORANGE-RED, YELLOW TIPPED petals and a maroon disc; June to August. Long, wiry stems - ideal border or cut flower. Any reasonable, well drained soil in sun. 60 to
Gaillardia x grandiflora 'Amber Wheels'	£4.20		Taller, more erect form with amber-yellow flowers having a large central orange-red centre. Flowers early summer to the frosts. Toothed grey leaves. Light, poor, free draining soil in sun. (6-10)75cm.
Galax urceolata	£7.50		Very tricky to grow, creeping woodlander with rosettes of rounded, leathery, crenated & toothed, thick textured soft green leaves, turning coppery red in winter. Bronze new growth. Narrow, unbranched spikes of greenish-white flowers during late spring & early summer. Cool, moist woodland soil with some shade. (4-5)
Galega 'Duchess of Bedford'	£5.65	3.00	Narrow, erect spikes of small pea-like, pale pink-blue & white, bi-coloured flowers; May-June. Erect, leafy perennial with pinnate leaves. Dislike root disturbance. Ordinary soil in sun or part shade.
Galega x hartlandii 'Alba' (AGM)	£5.80		Tall leafy perennial with divided pinnate leaves on erect stems. Sheaves of small pea-like pure white flowers on branched spikes all summer. Leave undisturbed when established. Any soil, including poor, in sun. 120x60cm.
Galega x hartlandii 'Lady Wilson' (AGM)	£5.75	3.00	Erect leafy perennial with divided, pinnate leaves for the back of the border. Narrow, erect spikes of small pea-like lilac-blue flowers are persistent throughout summer. Dislike root disturbance. Ordinary soil in sun or part shade. 120x60cm.
Galega 'His Majesty'	£5.75	3.00	Reliable border perennial with spikes of BLUE & WHITE, coconut-scented, pea-like flowers; August to October. Bright green, pinnate leaves. Any reasonable soil in a sunny site. 90x60cms.
Galega officinalis	£5.80	3.00	Vigorous, clump forming perennial with lax, pinnate, soft green leaves with pointed leaflets. Heads of pale mauve, sometimes white bicoloured flowers in racemes from late summer to early autumn. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. (5-8) 120cm.
Galega orientalis	£5.21		Short spikes of beautiful clear blue, violet tinted pea like flowers; early summer. Hairy stems & mounds of pinnate pale green foliage. Like a giant vetch. Any reasonable soil in a sunny site. 120x60cm.
Galium odoratum	£4.20		Spreading clumps of whorled, glossy green leaves that smell of new mown hay. Small star-like, WHITE flowers; March to May. Any reasonable soil in part or full shade. 15x90cms.
Galtonia candicans 'Moonbeam'	£12.75		This highly sought after, double flowered form has bowl shaped, white, double flowers, tinged green with up to 30 flowers on the one spikes. Fleshy, pale green leaves. Flower mid summer. Light, well drained soil in a sunny, sheltered spot. 90cm.
Galtonia viridiflora	£4.20		Elegant bulbous perennial the tall stems carrying large, fragrant, waxy, open, PALE GREEN, bell-like flowers with dark stamens - similar to a huge hyacinth; September & October. Long, lax, glaucous leaves. Rich fertile soil in sun. 90x30cm.
Gaura lindheimeri 'Cherry Brandy'	£4.20		Shorter hybrid, with woody stems having narrow dark green leaves with a red central vein. Four petalled blush pink flowers with a deeper centre & spur open irregularly up the spikes all summer & autumn. Sheltered well drained spot in sun. (5-10) 40cm.
Gaura lindheimeri 'Corrie's Gold'	£4.20		Willow-like stems clothed in pale green leaves edged yellow giving an overall pale effect. The starry, PALE PINKISH-WHITE flowers give a never ending display from June until September. For a well drained soil in a sunny site. 80x45cm.
Gaura lindheimeri 'Crimson Butterflies'	£4.20		Compact form with short spikes of deep pink-red flowers in succession all summer. Clumps of evergreen deep burgundy-red leaves. Hardy in a sheltered, well drained spot in sun. (5-10) 30cm.

Gaura lindheimeri 'Dwarf Pink'	£3.95	Very compact form on the borderlines of hardiness. Dark, bronze-purple leaves with a red suffusion. Short spikes of starry, deep-pink flowers with red central veins;- summer to the frosts. Very sheltered, well drained spot in sun. (6-10) 45cm.
Gaura lindheimeri 'Freefolk Rosy'	£4.50	Willowly perennial with the linear leaves grey, suffused green & edged cream. rich pink-purple on the new growth. Long spikes of starry white flowers with the petals finely edged red, from May to September. Needs a sharply drained soil in a sunny, sheltered spot.
Gaura lindheimeri 'Geyser Pink'	£4.20	One of the taller pink flowered forms with elegant wands carrying starry bright candy-pink flowers from crimson buds, over a long period through summer. The basal leaves are stained beetroot red. easy in well drained soil in or part shade. (6-10) 75cm.
Gaura lindheimeri 'Geyser White'	£4.50	medium sized, whippy upright perennial with red spotted basal leaves. Airy wands with starry white flowers, emerging from buds with just the merest touch of pink, over a long period through summer. easily grown in well drained soil in sun or light shade. (6-
Gaura lindheimeri 'Pink Dwarf'	£4.20	Does what it says on the tin. A dwarf form of Gaura with rich-pink flowers, held on wiry red stems through summer. Mounds of elliptic leaves, heavily flushed burgundy-red. Although not as hardy as white forms it is usually Ok in a warm, sheltered spot in sun & good in pots. (6-10) 45cm.
Gaura lindheimeri 'Pink Gin'	£4.20	Compact variegated form with the green leaves having a silver sheen. they are margined cream & pink, flushed bright pink on the new growth. short spikes of starry blush-pink flowers with a deeper pink centre, from May to the frosts. Best in a light, free draining, sheltered spot in sun. (5-10) 45cm.
Gaura lindheimeri 'Pink Panache'	£4.50	Bushy perennial with grey-green leaves, irregularly variegated gold & flushed reddish-pink on the new growth. Airy wands with rich pink flowers over a long period through summer to the frosts. Ideal for a summer patio pot or a well drained border in a sunny, sheltered spot. (6-10) 45cm.
Gaura lindheimeri 'Rosyjane'	£4.50	Erect perennial with widely spaced spikes of starry white flowers, each petal having a broad bright pink edge, becoming more suffused as the flower ages. Flowers from summer to the frosts. Light, well drained soil in sun. (6-10) 75cm.
Gaura lindheimeri 'Ruby Ruby'	£4.50	A taller pink flowered form with wands carrying bright-cerise-pink flowers, held on red stems during summer to the frosts. The elliptic leaves are heavily flushed burgundy red. Ideal summer patio pot. Light, free draining soil in sun or part shade. (6-9) 60cm.
Gaura lindheimeri 'Siskiyou Pink'	£4.20	Willowly stems with showy RASPBERRY-PINK flowers with a deeper eye; all summer & autumn. Good in pots & tubs - protect in winter. Needs a warm sheltered position in full sun & a well drained soil. 50x45cm. PROTECTED BY PLANT BREEDERS RIGHTS.
Gaura lindheimeri 'The Bride'	£3.95	Tall wands of waving stems have PURE WHITE 5-petalled flowers that open irregularly all summer into autumn. Willowy leaves often show red spotting. An airy plant of open, bushy habit. Well drained soil in full sun. 90x45cm.
Gaura lindheimeri 'Whirling Butterflies'	£4.20	Branching stems are clothed in four petalled, WHITE FLUSHED PINK flowers opening irregularly up the spike; midsummer through autumn. Narrow green willowly leaves. A tall, graceful, underrated perennial. Well drained soil in full sun. 60x45cm.
Gentiana asclepiadea (AGM)	£5.20	Slender, slow growing, graceful perennial with willow-like leaves on arching stems. RICH BLUE, trumpet-shaped flowers in the upperleaf axils; early autumn. Moist, rich deep soil, but chalk tolerant, in part or full shade. 90x60cm.
Gentiana asclepiadea 'Alba'	£5.20	Slow to mature & difficult to propagate. Arching stems with narrow, willow-like leaves. Clusters of WHITE flowers at the tips of the branches. Best in woodland soil in part shade. (7-8) 45cm. can be variable as they are seed raised.

Gentiana asclepiadea 'Knightshayes'	£5.80	Selected at Knightshayes garden in Devon, this slow growing hybrid has more widely flared, tubular, bell-shaped, gentian-blue flowers in late summer. Rare as it always takes at least four years to flower. Humus rich soil in part or full shade. (8-10) 60cm
Gentiana asclepiadea 'Pink Swallow'	£5.15	Slow growing form of willow gentian with the arching stems carrying narrowly bell-shaped soft pink flowers, from deeper buds;- held in the upper leaf axils in late summer & autumn. yellow autumn colour. Best in a rich woodland soil in part shade. (7-9) 45cm.
Gentiana dahurica	£4.50	A choice lime tolerant variety with basal rosettes of rich green leaves ascending up the stems. Trumpet shaped rich deep blue flowers have a paler throat & flower in late summer. Fertile not too dry soil in sun. 45x45cm.
Gentiana 'Diana'	£4.55	Small, rather unusual Gentian with erect stems having narrow, elliptic deep green, glossy leaves. Clusters of upward facing, narrowly tubular, intense gentian-blue flowers from July to September. For the front of the border or rockery. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. (7-9) 35cm.
Gentiana lutea	£5.50	Quite unlike most people's concept of a gentian. Whorls of pale yellow, tubular flowers held in green bracts on unbranched stems; summer. Large tufts of aspidistra-like leaves. Deep, rich, fertile soil in sun or part shade. 120x60cm.
Gentiana sino-ornata (AGM)	£4.20	Autumn flowering gentian forming evergreen mats of very fine, fresh green needle like leaves on trailing stems. Large, upward facing intense blue flowers, marked white in throat during autumn. Best in a retentive, neutral to acid soil in sun or part shade. (8-10)
Geranium 'Ann Folkard' (AGM)	£4.80	STRIKING RICH-MAGENTA-PURPLE FLOWERS WITH A BLACK CENTRE & radiating veins; June-September. A large spreading plant, leaves yellowish early season. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. 45cms.
Geranium 'Anne Thomson' (AGM)	£4.50	A new, much more compact plant like a smaller G.psilostemon. Large, cup-shaped, DEEP PURPLE flowers with a black eye; early summer. Deeply divided foliage takes on superb autumnal colour. Well drained soil in sun or part shade. 45x45cm.
Geranium 'Blue Pearl'	£4.50	A seedling from Brookside' with bowl-shaped, distinct pearly grey-blue flowers on spreading stems. Finely divided leaves. Good at the edge of a border. Retentive well drained soil in sun or part
Geranium 'Blue Sunrise'	£4.80	Clump-forming perennial the leaves attractively gold-tinted in spring turning greener in summer. Heads of violet-blue flowers veined a rich-violet; summer into late autumn. Prefers a fertile, reasonably drained soil in sun. 40x60cms.
Geranium 'Blushing Turtle'	£4.80	syn. 'Breathless'. Robust Canadian hybrid with finely divided, glossy green leaves on spreading stems. The flowers are rich-pink, veined deeper & held continuously from June to September. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-9) 25cm.
Geranium 'Brookside' (AGM)	£5.80	flowers: Large, cup-shaped, RICH DEEP-BLUE on branching stems; throughout summer. Tall, upright, leafy hybrid with clumps of fresh deep green, finely cut & divided leaves. Ordinary well drained soil in sun or part shade. 60x60cm.
Geranium 'Buckland Spider'	£5.20	Small, mat forming geranium with spreading stems clothed in small, shallowly lobed, purple-brown leaves. Small, almost stemless, cup-shaped bright purple-pink flowers with a tiny white eye, during midsummer. Needs a very sheltered spot in a sunny spot. (6-8)

Geranium caeruleatum	£4.80	A rather rare species for the rockery or front of the border. Looks much like a very compact sylvaticum. Carpets of toothed leaves & small, cup-shaped violet-blue flowers in May & June. Well drained soil in sun. (5-6) 20cm.
Geranium x cantabrigiense 'Berggarten'	£4.20	This German selection has sprays of warm coral-pink flowers in early to midsummer. Spreading carpets of glossy dark green divided aromatic leaves. Good ground cover for any reasonable soil in sun or shade. (6-8) 20cm.
Geranium x cantabrigiense 'Crystal Rose'	£4.50	Small, creeping more or less evergreen mat former with small, divided aromatic leaves. Small but very intense brightest magenta-pink flowers held just over the leaves, over a long period through early summer. Good edger for a well drained soil in sun or even dry shade. (5-7) 15cm.
Geranium x cantabrigiense 'Hanne'	£4.50	macrorrhizum x dalmaticum. Danish hybrid forming low mats of aromatic, glossy green leaves, tinted red in autumn. Cup-shaped pale-pink flowers gently suffusing white at the edges from late spring, often well into summer. Excellent ground cover for any reasonable soil in sun or shade. (5-8) 15cm.
Geranium x cantabrigiense 'Hilary Rendall'	£4.50	Short form, bred by Alan Bremner. Creeping mats of aromatic, more or less evergreen, glossy, divided leaves. Short stems carry small, palest icy-pink flowers, from April to early July. Foliage tints orange-red in autumn. Good ground cover even for shade. (4-7)
Geranium x cantabrigiense 'Show Time'	£4.50	Excellent more or less evergreen ground cover with mats of small, rich green, divided leaves on woody stems. Clusters of small white flowers with a pale pink flush, ageing a deeper pink;- late spring & early summer. Sun or shade. (5-7) 15cm.
Geranium x cantabrigiense 'Vorjura'	£4.20	macrorrhizum x dalmaticum. Evergreen creeping mats of small, fleshy, divided aromatic leaves. The rose-pink flowers have a fine white netting & eye;- late spring & early summer. Good edger for any reasonable soil in sun or shade. (5-8) 15cm.
Geranium 'Catherine Deneuve'	£4.50	New hybrid sitting somewhere between psilostemon x oxonianum. Strongly upright with striking, intense retina searing magenta-pink flowers with very narrow, gappy petals. Flowers through summer. a little shy the first year but when it settles it profuse. Retentive, well drained soil in sun. (6-9) 70cm.
Geranium 'Chantilly'	£4.50	(renardii x gracile) Upward facing lavender-pink flowers are freely produced all summer. Large, pale green basal leaves. Ordinary soil in sun or part shade. 45x45cm.
Geranium 'Criss Canning'	£5.20	Australian hybrid, a pratense x himalayense hybrid. Mounds of finely cut leaves. Branched stems with good sized, rich, gentian-blue flowers with purple veins, during late spring & early summer. Retentive soil in sun or part shade, (5-7) 40cm.
Geranium (Cinereum group) 'Lizabeth'	£4.50	Small rockery or front of the border hybrid forming a tight mound of scallop shaped grey-green leaves. Good sized white flowers with fine red veining during late spring & early summer. Needs excellent drainage in full sun. (5-6) 10x20cm.
Geranium (Cinereum Group) 'Thumbling Hearts'	£4.50	(Cinereum Group) Small, tufted, clump forming alpine with lobed, glaucous grey-green leaves. Short stems with cup-shaped blush pink with purple veining, blending towards a purple eye, Flowers early summer. Light, free draining soil in sun on a rockery. (5-6)
Geranium clarkei 'Kashmir White' (AGM)	£4.50	A good spreading plant with elegant, deeply cut fresh green leaves. Profusion of pure white flowers often veined lilac; early summer. Sun or part shade. 30x30cms. (5-6)
Geranium clarkei 'Mount Stewart'	£7.40	One of the largest flowered geraniums available. Large, bowl shaped palest lilac, almost white flowers with a heavily purple veined throat almost bleeding into a central patch;- early summer. Finely dissected leaves. Unaccountably rare. Sun/pt.sh. 40cm.
Geranium 'Colour Carousel'	£4.80	Rather sibiricum like with mounds of finely cut basal leaves. Rich pink flowers with a strident magenta star like pattern at the centre;- June to September. Retentive well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-9) 30cm.

Geranium 'Coquet Island'	£5.20	Named for an RSPB reserve off the Northumberland coast, this short form has rather striking, rich-blue flowers with a reddish halo around the white eye ;- late spring & early summer. Basal mounds of finely cut, fresh green leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (5-7) 40cm.
Geranium dalmaticum (AGM)	£4.20	Light pink, single flowers; May to August. Small leaves making a spreading mat giving good ground cover. Any reasonable soil in sun or light shade. 15cms.
Geranium dalmaticum 'Album' (AGM)	£4.20	Small, edging form or for the rockery. Dense mats of small, divided, shiny leaves with red autumnal colour. Clusters of white flowers stud the mat in late spring & early summer. Less vigorous than the species. Well drained soil in sun or light shade. (5-6) 15cm.
Geranium 'Danny Boy' (AGM)	£7.80	Rarely seen hybrid with narrow petalled, rich purple-pink flowers with burgundy veining & blue filaments, over a long period throughout summer. Mounds of divided, basal leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-9) 40cm.
Geranium 'Deux Fleurs'	£4.80	Much like a very tall bushy sanguineum hybrid. Mounds of finely cut, fresh green leaves, turning rich red in autumn. Rather large, rich purple-pink flowers, held in pairs from June to September, hence the name. Sterile so long flowering. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-9) 40cm.
Geranium 'Devon Pride'	£5.20	psilostemon hybrid. Rare old psilostemon hybrid, more lower growing with spreading, radiating stems. leaves turn reddish in autumn. Good sized rich reddish-magenta flowers with a purple-black eye;- early summer. Rich, never too dry soil in sun or part
Geranium 'Dilys' (AGM)	£4.50	Small but showy INTENSE VIOLET-PURPLE, cup-shaped flowers are freely produced all summer. Showy, spreading ground coverer of prostrate habit much like G.sanguineum. Ordinary soil in sun or part shade. 20x60cm.
Geranium 'Diva'	£4.50	Forms neat mounds of yellow-flushed leaves. Heads of red-purple red veined flowers; June-July. Any reasonable, fertile soil in sun or part shade. Ht: 30cms.
Geranium 'Dragon Heart'	£4.80	A more compact psilostemon hybrid with spreading, trailing stems with intense magenta-pink flowers, with a blackberry black eye & veining;- summer. Best scrambling through other low perennials. Well drained soil in sun or part shade. (5-7) 60x90cm.
Geranium 'Dreamland'	£4.50	Small, edger, excellent tumbling over paths, flowering continuously all summer. Heads of soft pink flowers, veined deeper & having a distinct white eye, from May to September. Small, scallop-shaped leaves. Best in a light, free draining soil in sun or part shade. (5-8)
Geranium endressii x psilostemon	£4.60	
Geranium erianthum 'Blues In The Night'	£5.50	A Robin Moss selection of this not too easy to grow species. Needing plenty of moisture & a little shade, it is very slow to multiply. Clumps of large, divided & sharply toothed leaves. Hairy buds open to mid-blue flowers with deeper veining, during
Geranium erianthum 'Neptune'	£5.20	Always in short supply, this spreading perennial has divided, hairy leaves. Cup-shaped rich-blue flowers in profusion during May, flowering intermittently all summer. Best in a rich, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (5-8) 40cm.
Geranium 'Eureka Blue'	£4.50	This is completely identical to 'Orion' distinguishable in no feature. Airy form with sprays of rich blue flowers from May to September. very finely divided, fresh green leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (6-9) 60cm.
Geranium 'Eva'	£4.80	Much like a compact form of 'Patricia' with intense cerise flowers with a prominent black eye;- midsummer. Much divided leaves with good autumn colour. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-8) 45cm.

Geranium 'Fay Anna'	£4.50	wlassovianum hybrid with spreading stems, emerging rich coppery-red in spring. The leaves are stained purple. Small, cup-shaped lavender-blue, white eyed flowers during mid to late summer. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-8) 40cm.
Geranium gracile	£5.80	A good ground covering form with pink flowers veined red; June to August. Native of N.Iran & Caucasus. Soft green, slightly felted leaves. Any reasonable soil in part shade. 45x75cm.
Geranium gymnocaulon	£5.80	A species from NE Turkey & the Caucasus. Rich violet-blue flowers with a darker veining and notched petal; July-August. Divided leaves. Reasonably drained soil in sun or part shade. Ht: 40cms.
Geranium gymnocaulon x platypetalum	£5.20	Bred by the late Bill Baker, but never named, this has striking violet-blue flowers, with darker veining. Large, hairy divided leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (6-7) 45x45cm.
Geranium 'Harmony'	£4.80	Rarely seen hybrid, very slow to multiply hence it's scarcity. Very finely cut, divided leaves. Good sized soft sky-blue flowers with slightly deeper veining;- early to midsummer. Needs good living as it can be miffy. (5-7) 45cm.
Geranium himalayense 'Baby Blue'	£5.65	Dwarf, condensed form of this gently spreading Geranium, with generous, bowl-shaped soft-blue flowers with deeper veining, fluted pink at the eye;- late spring & early summer. Finely cut leaves. Well drained soil in sun or part shade.(5-7) 30cm
Geranium himalayense 'Derrick Cooke'	£4.50	Very distinct form with huge white flowers with a strong purple veining during late spring & early summer. Finely divided leaves with a running root. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (5-7) 30cm.
Geranium himalayense 'Gravetye' (AGM)	£4.20	Spreading deciduous ground cover. large cup-shaped violet-blue flowers with a red central zone & white eye. The much dissected leaves are smaller than the species. Well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-8) 30cm.
Geranium himalayense 'Irish Blue'	£3.95	Large, cup-shaped, PALE ICE-BLUE flowers with a pinkish flush in the eye; commencing early summer. Basal clumps of divided leaves. Retentive yet well drained soil in sun or part shade.
Geranium himalayense 'Pale Irish Blue'	£4.50	A seedling from Irish Blue' a paler & softer blue flowered form. Creeping mats of finely dissected leaves turning red in autumn. Generous cup-shaped palest blue flowers during early summer. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (6-7) 30cm.
Geranium himalayense 'Plenum'	£4.50	Good ground coverer with dainty, deeply cut leaves with reddish autumn tints. Abundant fully DOUBLE, LILAC-PURPLE flowers May to July. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. 30x60cms
Geranium ibericum	£4.50	Handsome deeply cut, hairy, rounded leaves with sticky stems richly tinted in Autumn. Many cup-shaped violet-blue flowers with darker veining; May & June. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. 60x60cm.
Geranium ibericum x libani	£4.80	Seedling from Bill Baker with a lot more ibericum than libani in it. Basal mounds of softly haired light green leaves. Cup-shaped intense, inky violet-blue flowers, slightly with age, during early & midsummer. Best in a light, free draining soil in sun or light shade.
Geranium incanum	£4.35	Frothy mounds of finely divided fresh silver-green leaves topped by cup shaped deep pinky-purple flowers in late summer. Not reliably hardy & should be protected in Winter. Well drained soil in sun. 45x45cm.
Geranium 'Johnson's Blue' (AGM)	£4.50	Lovely variety with abundant BRIGHT BLUE cup-shaped flowers for a long period; mid-summer. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. 40cms.

Geranium 'Joy'	£4.50	Attractive, rather sprawling perennial, with grey-green leaves on radiating stems. Beautiful pale-pink flowers with deep purple stamens in early summer. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-7) 45cm.
Geranium 'Kanahitobanawa'	£4.50	x oxonianum thurstonianum x psilostemon. Remarkable hybrid from Desirable plants with the habit of psilostemon but with zingy, narrow petalled intense cerise-magenta flowers over a long period from early summer often into autumn. Sun or part shade. 90cm.
Geranium 'Kashmir Green'	£4.80	At last a good white flowered form selected by Piet Oudolf in Holland. A little slow initially, this has mid sized pure white flowers with green veining at the eye during late spring into summer. Finely cut, delicate leaves. Any soil in sun or pt.sh. (5-7)30cm.
