

Haberlea ferdinandi-coburgii 'Connie Davidson'	£5.80	Needing cool, moist shade, this forms more or less evergreen rosettes of thick textured, deeply veined leaves. Clusters of narrowly tubular, violet-blue flowers with a white marked throat, during late spring. A challenging plant for East Anglia. (4-5) 10cm.
Hedychium aurantiacum	£5.50	One of the hardier species with erect stems topped by spikes of rich golden-yellow flowers with deeper filaments in late autumn & early winter. Only hardy in sheltered, well drained mild spots in sun. (9-11) 120cm.
Hedychium coronarium	£5.20	Upright perennial, with pointed dark-green leaves, downy beneath. Very fragrant butterfly like white flowers with a yellow base are borne in cylindrical spikes in mid to late summer. hardy only in a very sheltered well drained spot in sun. (8-9) 300cm
Hedychium densiflorum	£5.20	Upright clump former, with lance-shaped glossy green leaves. Dense cylindrical spikes of fragrant pale-orange flowers with cream filaments. One of the hardier species for a very sheltered well drained spot in the south. (8-9) 400cm.
Hedychium densiflorum 'Stephen'	£5.80	Densely packed, compact cylindrical spikes of pale orange-yellow flowers, with striking orange anthers. Well scented. Pointed leaves on upright stems. Flowers during late summer in a very sheltered, well drained spot in sun. Marginally hardy. (8-9) 180cm.
Hedychium ellipticum	£5.20	Dense spikes of pale yellow-white flowers, with two-lobed lower lips & unusual purple filaments. Flowers late summer & autumn. Upright stems, with broad dark-green leaves. Marginally hardy in a sheltered well drained spot in sun. (8-9) 200cm.
Hedychium flavescens	£5.80	A more tender but showy species from Bengal, with dense spikes of pale-yellow flowers, with green lobes. The lip has a red stain, with protruding yellow filaments. Upright stems with broad fleshy leaves. Almost certainly will need lifting in winter. (7-10) 270cm.
Hedychium greenii	£5.80	Will probably need winter protection unless grown in a favourable position. Exotic broad handsome leaves up the stems topped by spidery red flowers with long filaments throughout summer. highly fragrant. Retentive well drained soil. 150x60cm.
Hedychium spicatum Himalayan Lipstick'	£5.80	Distinct form of spicatum with the narrow, glossy green leaves having a distinct red flush to the reverses. Rather spidery white flowers with a pink flush with rich pink filaments;- late summer & autumn. Sheltered, well drained spot in sun. (8-10) 120cm.
Helenium 'Amber'	£4.50	Indianersommer' x 'Julisamt'. Very tall hybrid, raised in Belgium with amber flowers heavily streaked orange, from July to September. One for the back of the border in a retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (7-9) 150cm.
Helenium 'Autumn Lollipop'	£4.20	Probably a form of puberulum this is very architectural for the border & flower arranger. Branched stems with pom-pom like rusty golden-brown cones with just the smallest frill of drooping yellow petals;- mid to late summer. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-8) 90cm.
Helenium 'Blutentisch' (AGM)	£4.50	Daisy like, rather flat sunny-yellow, unfrilled petals with a raised burgundy-red cone, emerging from green buds. Heavy heads on much branched stems. Light, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (7-8) 90cm.
Helenium 'Can Can'	£4.50	Heads of good sized, rusty orange-red flowers with the tips of the petals dipped in gold. They are held on well branched stems during late summer into autumn. Woody stems with linear leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (7-10) 80cm.
Helenium 'Chelsey'	£4.50	New hybrid, very floriferous & excellent, well branched habit. Upward facing, daisy like, rich crimson flowers with yellow highlights;- mid to late summer. Like a retentive, light, sandy soil in sun. (7-8) 120cm.

Helenium 'Double Trouble'	£4.50	The world's first fully double flowered Helenium with branched heads of rather small, two layered, double yellow flowers in profusion from late summer into autumn around a golden cone. Well drained soil in sun. (8-10) 80cm.
Helenium 'El Dorado'	£4.50	Thought of by the national collection holder as one of the best varieties, this short form has good sized, rich yellow flowers around a deep brown cone from late summer into autumn. Very long flowering. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (7-10) 85cm.
Helenium 'Feuersiegel' (AGM)	£4.50	Golden ray florets with a brown flush. Has a dark brown, central cone. Good for the prairie border, giving good colour in late summer. Prefers of free draining, sandy soil in sun. (7-9) 120cm.
Helenium 'Gold Doubloons'	£4.50	This scarce variety seemingly originated in Italy. A tall form with rather larger single, rich gold flowers with a slightly deeper eye during late summer & autumn. A good candidate for the back of the border. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (7-9) 120cm.
Helenium 'Indianersommer'	£4.50	Handsome German selection, with large copper-red flowers, with a raised central cone. Good late summer colour for a retentive yet free draining soil in sun. (7-8) 100cm.
Helenium 'Loysder Wieck'	£4.50	Unusual with narrow scrolled petals, rusty orange brown on the reverses, yellow on the top but almost not showing. Rusty orange cone. Flowers mid to late summer. Retentive, free draining soil in sun. (7-9) 90cm.
Helenium 'Mardi Gras'	£4.50	Good late summer perennial with the upward facing flowers emerging a soft buff-gold, becoming heavily mottled & splashed orange red, the colour intensifying as they mature;- June to August. Retentive, well drained soil in sun. (6-8) 100cm.
Helenium 'Moerheim Beauty' (AGM)	£4.50	Upright, much branched stems covered in large, BROWN-RED, daisy-like flowers with a velvety central dome; flowers over along period. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. 90cms. Flowers: July-September
Helenium 'Pipsqueak'	£4.20	Shorter, more vigorous form with the flower dominated by a large bronze-brown cone around a skirt of slightly drooping golden yellow ray petals; late summer into autumn. Good prairie plant for well drained soil in sun. (7-9) 55cm.
Helenium 'Potter's Wheel'	£4.50	Shorter form with rich, dusky-red flowers, the edge of each petal is finely highlighted in yellow. Raised rusty brown cone. Flowers July to september. Retentive soil in sun or light shade. (7-9) 60cm.
Helenium puberulum	£4.20	syn. 'Autumn Lollipop'. Very unusual hybrid with almost large rounded heads of brown, turning yellow as the tiny ring of yellow flowers develop. Excellent for wildlife & cutting & very long flowering in the garden. Retentive, well drained soil in sun. (8-9) 100cm.
Helenium 'Pumilum Magnificum'	£4.20	Smaller flowered, rather elegant hybrid with upward facing, yellow flowers stained red at the base, around a raised brown cone;- mid summer into autumn. Any retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (6-8) 90cm.
Helenium 'Rauchtopas'	£4.50	Unusual soft coppery yellow flowers with fine brown flecks, especially at the tips of the petals. Brown cone. The reverses are more brown tinged. A tall variety for retentive, free draining, preferably sandy soil in sun. (7-10) 120cm.
Helenium 'Red Jewel'	£4.50	Shorter form with dense clusters of rather small rich dusky reddish-pink flowers with a maroon cone which ages rusty gold. Tidy erect perennial flowering mid to late summer. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (7-9) 85cm.

Helenium 'Ruby Charm'	£4.50		Shorter form with the flowers initially opening a ruby red, turning a more fiery orange-red as they age. Rusty brown cone. Flowers late summer into autumn. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (7-9) 60cm.
Helenium 'Ruby Tuesday'	£4.50		Dwarf, compact form & an excellent doer in the open garden. Tidy, slightly reflexing, small dark-red flowers around a raised golden cone, eventually ageing brown;- late summer. Retentive, free draining soil in sun or light shade. (7-9) 50cm.
Helenium Sahin's Early Flowerer' (AGM)	£6.75	2.00	Very large flowered form, with a rich gold on emergence quickly ageing soft apricot orange with an orange central flush & streaking. Compact & long flowering. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (6-10) 90cm.
Helenium 'Salsa'	£4.80		Shorter form with rather narrow petalled rich rusty bright-red flowers, suffused almost gold at the tips. Striking brown cone. Flowers late summer into autumn. Loved by bees. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (7-9) 60cm.
Helenium 'The Bishop'	£4.50		Erect stems topped by upward facing golden-yellow daisies with a brown central cone & frilled petals; June-September. Excellent showy perennial for autumn colour. Divide regularly. Ordinary soil in sun or part shade. 60x45cm.
Helenium 'Tie Dye'	£4.50		Strange new hybrid from Thierry Delabroye with narrow, gappy petalled yellow flowers, purple-pink on the reverses. The edges incurve to make the flower look striped. Flowers July to September. Good for cutting. Any reasonable, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (7-9) 80cm.
Helenium 'Tijuana Brass'	£4.50		Very tall, strong growing back of the border variety with very large, rich brassy golden-yellow flowers around a strongly raised golden-brown cone. Flowers during late summer & early autumn. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (5-9) 150cm.
Helenium 'Wesergold' (AGM)	£4.20		Compact, free-flowering form, with golden-yellow daisies, with horizontally held rays & a golden rusty-brown central cone. This new German hybrid requires a well drained, retentive soil in sun. (7-9) 60cm.
Helenium 'Wonnadonga'	£4.50		This is a constantly changing form. The flowers open a rich coppery-red, initially opening with a strong yellow flush. The reverses are darker copper-red with distinctly rolled edges. Flowers late summer into autumn. Erect stems with small, sparse, lance-shaped leaves. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. (7-9) 130cm.
Helenium 'Wyndley'	£4.20		Golden-yellow flowers, with a light overlay of orange, with a central cone of orange-brown. flowers midsummer to early autumn. Fertile, moist, well drained soil in sun. (7-9) 80cm.
Helianthella quinquenervis	£4.15		Imposing back of the border perennial with stout stems topped by nodding, YELLOW, single daisies; late summer & autumn. Bold, basal clumps of leaves. Retentive well drained soil in sun or part shade. 150x90cm.
Helianthus 'Capenoch Star' (AGM)	£4.00		Large, lemon-yellow daisies with quilled petals & a darker yellow eye; midsummer through autumn. Tall back of the border plant. Good for cutting. Fertile retentive soil in sun. 1.5x1.2m.
Helianthus giganteus 'Sheila's Sunshine'	£4.50		Tall, imposing back of the border perennial with medium sized, single primrose coloured daisies with pointed, slightly quilled petals;- late summer through autumn. Strong grower in retentive soil in sun or part shade. (8-10) 200cm.
Helianthus 'Happy Days'	£4.50		Shorter form with good sized yellow flowers with single ray petals around a very large, anemone centred eye;- late summer into autumn, like a shorter Morgensonne'. Easily grown in retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (7-10) 60cm.

Helianthus x kellermanii	£4.50		Huge, imposing back of the border perennial, with strong, often woody stems topped by rather small, single, golden yellow daisies throughout late summer into autumn. Whorls of long, narrow arching leaves. Fertile, humus rich, retentive soil. (9-10) 300
Helianthus 'Lemon Queen' (AGM)	£4.50		Large, pale yellow daisies with a deeper eye are freely produced; late summer through mid autumn. Soft green leaves on tall stems. Fertile retentive soil in sun. 1.7x1.2m.
Helianthus microcephalus 'J.S.Straffe Prairie Gast'	£4.50		Tall, back of the border daisy like plant with stout stems having narrow, fine green leaves. open heads of small citron yellow sunflowers during late summer & autumn. retentive soil in sun or part shade. (7-9) 150cm.
Helianthus 'Miss Mellish' (AGM)	£4.50		Impossibly running but beautiful sunflower with good sized intense golden-yellow flowers with twisted petals around a dark cone;- late summer into autumn. Shallow rooting so can be removed easily. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. Ht tp 100cm.
Helianthus 'Monarch' (AGM) ???	£4.50		Claimed to be the real thing, if so it will be tricky to grow. Muddled with other species this has very large, bold, brassy, slightly incurving golden-yellow flowers during late summer & autumn. Even if it isn't it's excellent. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. Gently spreads. (8-10) 160cm.
Helianthus pauciflorus	£4.20		syn. Helianthus rigidus. Shorter form from Minnesota with erect, unbranched stems topped by good sized, single golden-yellow daisies, over a long period during mid to late summer. The leaves are rough sandpaper textured & rather sparse. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (7-9) 100cm.
Helianthus salicifolius	£4.80		Clump forming perennial, with whorls of narrow, arching willow like leaves on tall stems. Large golden-yellow daisies with a brown central disc in early & mid autumn. Fertile, humus rich, moist well drained soil in sun. (8-10) 250cm.
Helianthus salicifolius 'Table Mountain'	£6.75	2.00	One of the dwarfest sunflowers with large, semi-double, golden-yellow flowers with a small dark eye during late summer & autumn. Very floriferous with flowers in dense heads. Retentive, well drained soil in sun. (6-9) 50cm.
Helianthus 'Soleil D'or'	£4.50		Bold, impressive, back of the border plant, with large double yellow daisies on stout stems in late summer & mid autumn. Lance shaped hairy dark-green leaves. Fertile, rich yet well drained soil in full sun. 150cm.
Helianthus tuberosus	£5.45	2.00	Unusual tuberous form, with stout stems carrying single deep-yellow daisies with a paler yellow eye. Coarse leaves on strong upright stems. Back of the border in retentive well drained soil in sun or light shade. (8-9) 300cm.
Helianthus unknown hybrid	£4.50		Bold, back of the border perennial found by John Graham in the garden of Lord (he can't remember his name). Different to anything else in cultivation, it is obviously an old hybrid. Tall stems topped by semi-double brassy golden flowers during late summer & autumn. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. (8-10) 150cm.
Helichrysum amorginum 'Ruby Cluster'	£4.50		Choice evergreen perennial with rosettes of narrow, felted grey leaves. Short, branched stems with striking red buds opening to daisy like cream flowers with a yellow eye;- summer. Needs sharply drained soil in sun. (6-8) 45cm.

Helichrysum 'Schweffellicht'	£4.50		(Sulphur Light') Low, spreading, semi-evergreen with narrow, intensely woolly, aromatic white leaves. Button-like sulphur-yellow flowers in late summer. For a hot dry garden in well drained sunny site. 45x45cm.
Helicodicerus muscivorus	£4.45		Formerly included in Dracunculus, this produces a green-white spathe, streaked purple-brown with a mottled purple-red throat & green spadix. Smells of rotting flesh. Pairs of large, divided, glossy dark-green leaves. needs a warm, sheltered sunny spot.
Heliopsis helianthoides	£5.65	2.00	Native across much of Eastern North America, this back of the border species has strong stems with good sized, rich golden-yellow single daisies, through late summer & autumn. Coarse, hairy leaves up the stems. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (8-10) 120cm.
Heliopsis helianthoides 'Lorraine Sunshine'	£4.50		One of the first yellow daisies to flower with single golden yellow flowers;- mid to late summer. Striking leaves completely covered in a network of silver white veining. Needs good living to thrive. Good for cutting. Fertile, rich, well drained soil in sun. (7-9) 80cm.
Heliopsis helianthoides scabra 'Asahi'	£4.50		Shorter species with comparatively small, pom pom like, fully double, golden-yellow flowers, held on long stalks;- mid to late summer. Likes a well drained soil in sun. (6-9) 60cm.
Heliopsis helianthoides scabra 'Benzinggold'	£5.75	2.00	Tall, back of the border 'sunflower' an old & rarely seen cultivar. Stout stems topped by good sized, just semi-double rich golden-yellow daisies over a long period in autumn. Best in a retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (7-9) 150cm.
Heliopsis helianthoides scabra 'Mars'	£4.50		Tall, back of the border hybrid with large, semi-double, rich golden-yellow daisies, slightly recurving as they age. Flowers July to september. Best in a retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (6-9) 150cm.
Heliopsis helianthoides scabra 'Patula'	£4.20		Bold, back of the border perennial, with large, single, orange gold daisies on tall stems during late summer & early autumn. Coarse leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (7-9) 120cm.
Heliopsis helianthoides scabra 'Prairie Sunset'	£4.50		Distinct colour break with many small, golden-yellow, single daisies with a red stained zone around a bright red cone;- late summer. Serrated toothed leaves on dark stems. Well drained soil in sun. (6-9) 120cm.
Heliopsis helianthoides scabra 'Spitzentanzerin'	£4.20		Tall leafy perennial, with semi-double DARK-GOLD upward facing flowers on stout stems late in the season. Large coarse leaves. Good for cutting. Fertile, rich well drained soil in sun. (8-10) 120cm.
Heliopsis helianthoides scabra 'Summer Nights'	£4.50		Tall perennial with rich golden yellow flowers with a burgundy eye on dark purple stems;- late summer & autumn. The leaves have a smokey bronze flush. Rich, retentive yet well drained soil in sun. (6-9) 120cm.
Heliopsis helianthoides scabra 'Venus'	£4.50		Formal, large semi-double golden-yellow daisies with a deeper golden-orange centre. Remarkable for it's stout stems which rarely need staking. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. (7-8) 90cm.
Heliopsis helianthoides 'Tuscan Sun'	£4.80		Short perennial sunflower, initially bred for pots but also good for the border. Well branched stems carry good sized rich golden-yellow daisies with an orange cone from late summer through autumn. easily grown in a retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (8-10) 45cm.

Helleborus argutifolius (AGM)	£4.80		(syn. H.corsicus) Bushy stout-stemmed plants with striking evergreen leaves. Clusters of beautiful pale-green pendant cup-like flowers. Humus-rich retentive soil in sun or part shade. 60cms. Flowers: Jan-May
Helleborus atrorubens (of.hort)	£5.80		Much confusion surrounds this plant. This looks much like an orientalis with clusters of cup-shaped soft smokey pink-purple flowers in early spring appearing with the deeply lobed glossy leathery leaves. Retentive soil in sun or shade. (2-4) 40cm.
Helleborus 'HGC Cinnamon Snow'	£11.40		(Hellebore Gold Collection) Attractive hybrid with dark green, lightly veined leaves with red stalks. Upward facing pink buds open to creamy yellow flowers before fading white & finishing with a cinnamon blush. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (2-5) 30cm.
Helleborus x ericsmithii 'Shooting Star'	£11.40		Strong growing evergreen with dusky rose buds, opening to white flowers that eventually fade to sage green. Flowers February to May. Deep green leaves with prominent silver veining and dark red stems. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (2-5) 35cm.
Helleborus x ericsmithii 'Winter Moonbeam'	£11.40	2.00	Profuse soft creamy white flowers age a dark dusky pink with age, held on red stems;- Late winter & spring. The much divided olive green leaves are strongly marbled pewter-grey. Rich, well drained soil in sun or light shade. Vigorous. (1-4) 30cm.
Helleborus x ericsmithii 'Winter Sunshine'	£11.40		Low mounds of evergreen, steely green leaves with a silvery sheen. Upward facing creamy-white flowers with a green stain age dusky pink on fading, held on burgundy stems. Long flowering from February to May. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (2-5) 40cm.
Helleborus foetidus (AGM)	£4.50		Handsome, clump-forming, architectural evergreen with deeply divided, dark green leaves. Stems topped with open clusters of beautiful apple-green bells edged maroon. Humus-rich soil in sun or part shade. 45x45cms. Flowers: Jan-April. POISONOUS.
Helleborus foetidus Wester Flisk Group	£7.85	2.00	Handsome evergreen with deeply divided purplish leaves & reddish stems. Sprays of pendant green bells, edged purple; February-April. Fertile, retentive soil in shade or sun. 60x60cms.
Helleborus x hybridus 'Harvington Apricots'	£7.85	1.00	Difficult to breed true to colour. The outer face of the petals are apricot-pink, more soft creamy apricot on the insides. AS WITH ALL HELLEBORES EXPECT SOME VARIATION. Humus rich, retentive, well drained soil in part shade. (2-4) 40cm.
Helleborus x hybridus 'Harvington Double Chocolate'	£14.50	2.00	Rather a distinct shaped flower with fully double, rather narrow petalled deep maroon flowers, with chocolate brown overtones. The petals are pointed & slightly quilled for a starry appearance. CAN BE VARIABLE FROM SEED LIKE ALL HELLEBORES. Best in a rich soil in part or full shade. (1-4) 45cm.
Helleborus x hybridus 'Double Purple Cascade'	£13.50	2.00	Very floriferous hybrid with rather nodding, fully double plum-purple flowers with narrow, almost incurving, claw like petals. Each stems has a high bud count. Flowers January to April. LIKE ALL HELLEBORES CAN BE VARIABLE FROM SEED. Best in a rich soil in part or full shade. (1-4) 35cm.
Helleborus x hybridus 'Double White Speckled'	£13.50	2.00	Almost triple flowered form with three layers of overlapping, broad white petals. They are almost all covered in a fine burgundy-red speckling. Flowers january to April. COLOUR CAN VARY FROM SEED LIKE ALL HELLEBORES. Best in a rich soil in part or full shade. (1-4) 40cm.

Helleborus x hybridus 'Harvington Double Yellows'	£13.50	2.00	Seed raised Hellebores which should hopefully give, fully double, soft sulphur-yellow flowers, usually unspotted. AS WITH ALL HELLEBORES EXPECT SOME VARIATION. Cool, humus rich, woodland soil in part shade. (1-4)40cm.
Helleborus x hybridus 'Harvington Dusky'	£2.00		A new strain so will need some selecting for uniformity. At it's best it has good sized dusky pink flowers heavily covered in fine purple speckling, just leaving the rim pink. As with all hellebores it can be a little variable. Rich, preferably woodland soil in part or full shade. (2-5) 40cm.
Helleborus x hybridus 'Harvington Golden Glory'	£10.50	2.00	Stunning hybrid most noticeable for it's yellow nectaries, very unusual on a Hellebore. One of the most yellow flowered forms with a ring of red staining in the throat. Flowers January to April. Forms o good, rounded, shape with overlapping petals. Rich soil in part or full shade. (1-4) 35cm.
Helleborus x hybridus 'Harvington Limes'	£9.50	2.00	A very strong growing hybrid breeding very true. Unusual cup-shaped lime-green flowers on well branched stems from january to April. Glossy, leathery divided leaves. Best in a rich, woodland soil in part or full shade. (1-4) 50cm.
Helleborus x hybridus 'Harvington Picotees'	£10.25	1.00	Seed raised hellebores which should hopefully be white with a picotee around the edge, veining & red reverses. AS WITH ALL HELLEBORES EXPECT SOME VARIATION. Cool, humus rich, woodland soil in light shade. (1-4)40cm.
Helleborus x hybridus 'Harvington Reds'	£7.85	1.00	Seed raised plants expected to give large bowl shaped red to purple- red flowers with the new leaves in late winter & early spring. AS WITH ALL HELLEBORES EXPECT SOME VARIATION. Cool, humus rich soil in light shade. (1-4)40cm.
Helleborus x hybridus 'Harvington Smokey Blue'	£10.25	1.00	Seed raised plants which should hopefully give a slatey, purple blue, almost black flowerS. AS WITH ALL HELLEBORES THE COLOUR CAN BE VARIABLE. Cool, moist, humus rich soil in part shade. (1-4)40cm.
Helleborus x hybridus 'Harvington Speckled Whites'	£9.50	2.00	Seed raised Hellebores which should give generous, bowl shaped white flowers spotted red but often with a green tinge;- late winter & early spring. AS WITH ALL HELLEBORES EXPECT SOME VARIATION. Cool, humus rich, woodland soil in part shade.(1-4)40cm.
Helleborus x hybridus 'Harvington Whites'	£7.85	1.00	White Hellebores offer a very strong growing plant, breeding almost totally true from seed. These plants have generous bowl-shaped white flowers with a small boss of cream stamens from January to April. Bold clumps of leathery leaves. Best in a rich, retentive soil in part or full shade. (1-4) 45cm.

A stemless species with rosettes of very narrow, grey-green curving leaves with white thread like appendages. Large, branched spikes of white flowers as it matures. likely to be cold hardy but may dislike winter wet.

Heuchera 'Prince'	£6.75		Very dark-purple, palm-shaped leaves are incredibly ruffled. Reddish-purple flower stems carry dainty sprays of small white flowers. Good ground cover for retentive soil in sun or part shade. (5-7) 50cm.

Heuchera richardsonii	£4.50	Native to Western North America, this woodland species has rosettes of mid-green, scallop-shaped leaves. Tall, airy spikes of greenish-yellow flowers with striking orange stamens, during midsummer. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or shade. (5-7) 80cm. collected Red Deer Area, Alberta, Canada.
Heuchera sanguinea 'Snow Storm'	£4.50	Lovely new form making a mound of evergreen, round leaves almost entirely cream in summer the main veins turning rosy-red in winter. Airy sprays of coral-red flowers in wiry stems in summer. Humus rich soil in part shade. 30x30cms.
Heuchera 'Silver Dollar'	£4.50	Basal mounds of almost entirely silver leaves, with just fine veining & edge a soft mint green. This provides a foil for the spikes of startling red flowers all summer. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or shade. (5-8) 45cm.
Heuchera 'Silver Heart'	£4.80	Rather large, soft coppery golden-orange leaves with a silver overlay, flushed rusty red on the reverse. The winter colour is a much darker rusty red. Airy sprays of small creamy white flowers during summer. Easy in any reasonable soil in sun or shade. (6-8) 45cm.

Hosta 'Enterprise'	£5.00	Medium leaved Hosta. Attractive, pointed almost white leaves with a broad, irregular bright green rim. Thick, heavy textured leaves. Spikes of trumpet shaped light lavender flowers. Best in a retentive soil with some shade. 90cm.
