

Ranunculus aconitifolius	£4.50		Vigorous leafy plant with dark green leaves and CLOUDS OF SINGLE, WHITE BUTTERCUPS in spring. Moist soil in sun or part shade. 90x90cms. Flowers: April-May.
Ranunculus acris 'Flore Pleno' (AGM)	£4.20		syn'Multiplex'. A choice form of the common buttercup which does not run! Basal clumps of divided foliage with wiry stems carrying posies of shining, double dazzling-yellow buttons in late spring. For ordinary not too dry soil in sun. 90x30cm.
Ranunculus acris 'Sulphureus'	£4.20		A beautiful form of our native meadow buttercup. Heavily branched stems carry cup shaped soft cream flowers with a gold ring around the eye, from April to June. Mounds of much divided leaves. Slower & non running. Retentive soil in sun or part shade. (4-7) 40cm.
Ranunculus flammula 'Golden Tower'	£4.20		Moisture loving buttercup creating a huge, airy plume of simple, cup-shaped glossy golden-yellow buttercups, held on upright stems through summer. Basal rosettes of rather small, glossy spathe shaped leaves. Retentive, even wet soil in sun or shade. (6-8) 90cm.
Ranunculus gramineus (AGM)	£4.50		Evergreen clump-former with narrow, erect, glaucous, grass-like leaves. Large, glistening YELLOW flowers are freely produced from late spring into summer. Well drained, yet retentive soil in sun. 45x30cm.
Ranunculus platanifolius	£5.65	2.00	Much like a large, open form of aconitifolius. divided basal leaves & well branched stems with airy, small chalky white buttercups;- early summer. Retentive or moist soil in sun or shade. (5-7) 120cm.
Ranunculus repens 'Buttered Popcorn'	£4.20		Golden, acid-yellow form of our native creeping Buttercup. Carpets of toothed, much divided leaves with short stems carrying golden-yellow buttercups in late spring & early summer. Good ground cover for retentive soil in sun or shade. (4-5) 15cm.
Ranunculus repens 'Cat's Eyes'	£4.20		Should be let loose in the garden with care. Very vigorous, creeping mats of deeply cut, evergreen leaves, variegated dark bronze-purple. Usual yellow flowers. Good in pots. Retentive soil in sun or shade. (5-8) 15cm.
Ranunculus repens 'Snowdrift'	£4.20		Very showy admittedly but nonetheless still a creeping buttercup, albeit a little less vigorous. Mats of divided leaves are heavily & uniformly splashed white. Cup-shaped golden-yellow flowers in late spring & early summer. Not too dry soil. (5-6) 30cm.
Reineckia carnea	£6.85		A close relative of Lily-of-the-Valley with sprays of light pink flowers with protruding stamens; autumn which nestle amongst the narrow, pale green leaves. Humus-rich soil woodland soil in shade. Dislikes excessive chalk. 30x30cm.
Reineckia sp. SDR 3605	£4.50		carnea is said to be the only species but this potential new species is very different. Running root with arching grey-green evergreen strap like leaves. Short spikes of pink tinged white flowers;- midsummer. Convallaria relative for part shade. 15cm.

Rheum alexandrae	£5.80	One of the most amazing sights in the Himalayan flora, this forms spikes of large cream, overlapping bracts which cover the small flowers. Rosettes of leathery leaves. Won't be easy, so only for the experienced, adventurous gardener. (7-8) 120cm.
Rheum australe	£5.15	Becoming popular, this giant has huge, oval to heart-shaped leaves on brown streaked stems. Dense, erect spikes of small, wine-red flowers flushed white; elongate when running to seed. Cool moist soil in sun or part shade. 180x150cm. Flowers: June-July.
Rheum 'Cally Giant'	£5.50	A huge form, collected in the eastern Himalayas, so technically should have a species name. Huge form with 100cm deep green leaves. Big, bold panicles of rich pink flowers during mid to late summer. true from seed. Retentive or moist soil in sun or part
Rheum henryi	£6.95	A form collected in China about which i can find out very little. Leaves are reminiscent of alexandrae but different. No flowers yet. Likely to need a retentive or moist soil in sun or light shade.
Rheum kialense	£5.20	Rare, quick-spreading ground covering perennial. Pointed, heart-shaped leaves are flushed red. Panicles of tiny creamy-pink flowers just above the foliage in summer. Moist, fertile soil in sun or shade. 30x90cm.
Rhodiola kirilovii rubra	£4.80	Formerly included in Sedum. Terminal heads of 5-petalled, rich orange-red flowers; summer. Erect stems with closely packed, narrow, dark green, fleshy leaves. Gently creeps underground. Ordinary soil in sun. 30x30cm.
Rhodiola rosea	£4.20	From a woody rootstock small, pink-bronze buds emerge into radiating stems clothed in intense blue-grey leaves. Heads of lime-green, starry flowers with long anthers from pink buds. Attractive all season. Well drained soil in full sun. 30x30cm.
Rodgersia 'Badenweiler'	£6.75	German hybrid, looking much like an aesculifolia hybrid. Strong growing mounds of chestnut like, lightly bronze tinted. deeply veined leaves. Airy, open spikes of creamy white flowers during midsummer. Humus rich, moist soil in sun or shade. Smaller than the species. (7-9) 100cm.
Rodgersia 'Bronze Peacock'	£5.50	A miniature & one with one of the darkest leaves available. Much divided, coarse textured glossy dark brown leaves, holding their colour all season. Airy plumes of soft pink flowers on short stems during summer followed by showy seed heads. Retentive or moist soil in sun or shade. (6-7) 50cm.
Rodgersia 'Herkules'	£4.45	This showy form has large, airy plumes of small, fluffy true-pink flowers on much branched red flushed stems. Rosettes of much divided, thick textured, dark-green, deeply veined leaves with serrated edges. Retentive or moist soil in sun or part shade. (6-7) 120cm.
Rodgersia 'Kupfermond'	£5.50	Rarely seen German hybrid with very long, upstanding spikes of rich pink flowers, held on dark flushed stems during midsummer. The coarse, much divided leaves emerge with a rich copper flush. easily grown in a retentive or moist soil in sun or part shade. (6-8)
Rodgersia La Blanche'	£5.00	Dwarfer form, ideal for the modern garden, with erect spikes of fluffy, creamy flowers from bronze flushed buds;- April & May. Large, chestnut like, corrugated green leaves with good autumn colour. Retentive or moist soil in sun or shade. (4-5) 80cm.
Rodgersia nepalensis EMAK713	£5.50	Rare Nepalese species with mounds of very unusual, glossy, pinnate leaves with rounded leaflets. Red stems carry erect narrow spikes of white flowers, ageing rose;- late summer & early autumn. Retentive or moist soil in sun or light shade. Ht to 2mtrs.
Rodgersia pinnata	£5.65	A bold plant for a moist bed or pondside planting. The large basal leaves are arranged in pairs topped by an airy plumes of creamy-pink small flowers all summer. Best in sun or part shade. 90x60cm.

Rodgersia pinnata 'Pink Beauty'	£5.80	Bold, moisture lover with thick, deeply veined leaves, flushed red on the new growth. impressive spikes of rich candy-pink flowers from red buds during midsummer. Retentive or moist soil in sun or shade. (6-8) 90cm.
Rodgersia pinnata 'Buckland Beauty'	£6.45	Rarely available, this is one of the most striking of these pondside giants. Divided corase leaves turn intense burgundy red in autumn. Airy plumes of deep pink flowers ageing a rich burgundy red;- midsummer. Retentive or moist soil. (7-8) 120cm.
Rodgersia pinnata 'Cally Coral'	£5.75	Selected at Cally Gardens, this is a superb species with large, deeply divided leaves, turning rich bronze-purple in autumn. Bold, pyramidal panicles of rich coral red flowers during mid to late summer. Best in a retentive or moist soil in sun or part shade. (7-9)
Rodgersia pinnata 'Cally Salmon'	£6.30	Selected at Cally gardens, this is particularly striking for it's bold spikes of rich-salmon pink flowers on red stems, ageing ruddy red with age;- late summer into autumn. The chestnut like leaves are tinged burgundy, deeper in autumn. Retentive or moist soil in sun or shade. (7-9) 150cm.
Rodgersia pinnate 'Candy Clouds'	£5.20	Airy, pyramidal plumes of rich candy-pink flowers, held on red flushed stems throughout midsummer. Mounds of palmate, rugose, dark-green leaves heavily flushed burgundy, with good autumn colour. Best in a retentive or moist soil in sun or shade. (6-8)
Rodgersia pinnata 'Chocolate Wing'	£6.30	Superb foliage plant with the new leaves emerging a rich cocolate-brown. They are green by summer, turning burgundy-red in autumn. Pale-pink flowers open from burgundy-red buds during summer. Retentive or moist soil in sun or pt,sh. (6-8)60cm.
Rodgersia pinnata 'Crug Cardinal'	£6.80	Selected by crug Farm, this has bold spikes of bright-pink flowers during mid summer, turning cardinal red as the flowers age. Much divided leaves with a rich bronze flush. Retentive or moist soil in sun or shade. (6-8) 120cm.
Rodgersia pinnata 'Jade Dragon Mountain'	£5.50	Superlative form, collected by Roy Lancaster on this mountain in China. Conical panicles of red buds, opening blush pink & ageing cream, held on red stems during summer. Deeply veined, divided leaves with a red flush. Retentive or moist soil in sun or shade. (6-7) 90cm.
Rodgersia pinnata 'Maurice Mason'	£7.75	Bold, architectural plant with large, deeply cut, maple like leaves emerging with a reddish-bronze flush., also appearing in autumn. Large, airy plumes of reddish flowers in summer. Retentive or moist soil in sun or part shade. (6-8) 120cm.
Rodgersia pinnata 'Snow Clouds'	£5.20	Clumps of very large, rugose, palmate, deep-green divided leaves with no reddish flush. Airy, pyramidal plumes of small white flowers over a long period through midsummer. Excellent planted beside ponds. Retentive or moist soil in sun or shade. (6-8) 120cm.
Rodgersia pinnata 'Superba' (AGM)	£5.85	DIVISIONS OF THE TRUE PLANT. VERY RARE!!! Rich bronze-flushed leaves emerge in spring. Large pyramidal plumes of ROSE-RED flowers create a hazy effect followed by impressive seed heads. Damp, cool, moist soil in sun or part shade. 90x60cm.
Rodgersia podophylla 'Rotlaub'	£5.20	(Red Leaf') Large, bold, feature plant with huge, deeply jagged leaves edged red & on the reverses but emerge bronze. Plumes of cream flowers in summer. Moist soil in sun or part shade. 90x90cm.
Rodgersia purdomii (of hort.)	£6.75	Smaller species, with clumps of chestnut like, divided, bronze tinted leaves. Narrow spikes of fluffy creamy white flowers during midsummer. Retentive oir moist soil in sun or part shade. (6-8)
Rodgersia sambucifolia 'Mountain Select'	£5.35	More compact form with chestnut list, more deeply cut corase green leaves. Plumes of small, iry white flowers followed by persistent ruddy red seed heads;- mid to late summer. Retentive or moist soil in sun or part shade, (5.35
Rodgersia 'Stoke Gabriel'	£5.50	Selected by the National collection holder, this has some pinnate in it. Divided leaves on red stalks. Arching, plume like open inflorescences of white flowers on striking red stems from mid to late summer. Retentive or moist soil in sun or shade. (6-8) 120cm.

Romanzoffia californica	£4.80	Rare species from around the S.Francisco Bay area. Scallop shaped, thick textured, glossy green leaves. Clusters of four petalled, single white flowers in profusion;- early summer. Humus rich, retentive soil in part or full shade. Taller than other species.
Roscoea auriculata	£4.50	(syn.R.sikkimensis) Orchid-like BRIGHT PURPLE flowers with a large lower lip; freely produced in late summer. Slow, clump forming perennial with broad, waxy leaves clasping the thick stems. Humus-rich, retentive soil in cool shade. 45x45cm.
Roscoea auriculata 'Floriade'	£5.20	Very vigorous, larger form of auriculata with orchid like, violet-purple flowers, marked white in the throat during summer. Fleshy, stem clasping, leathery, strap like leaves. Humus rich, retentive, well drained soil in part shade. (6-8) 60cm.
Roscoea auriculata 'White Cap'	£5.20	Very distinct form with very broad, horizontally held, fleshy leaves. Good sized rich purple flowers with prominent white markings in the throat;- late summer. Retentive, well drained soil in part or full shade. (7-9) 50cm.
Roscoea australis	£5.20	The southernmost species of Roscoea, from high mountainous regions of Burma, & only described in 1982. Erect stems with fleshy, stem clasping leaves. Exotic purple-pink flowers only just extend beyond the calyx, flowering from May to September. Humus rich, retentive soil in part shade. (5-9) 40cm.
Roscoea x beesiana	£4.50	(R.auriculata x R.cautleyoides) Orchid-like, papery, PRIMROSE-YELLOW flowers freely produced; early summer. Leafy, long, mid-green leaves clasp the stems. Dislikes root disturbance. Fertile, humus-rich, retentive soil in cool shade. 45x30cms.
Roscoea cautleyoides 'Jeffrey Thomas' (AGM)	£5.20	Strong growing hybrid with broad, fleshy, stem clasping leaves on stout stems. Showy, orchid like, almost white flowers with a soft cream flush appear in the crown in summer. Fertile, humus rich soil in part shade. (6-7) 50cm.
Roscoea cautleyoides 'Purple Queen'	£4.80	One of the best cautleyoides hybrids receiving an Award of Garden Merit at the recent Wisley trial. Tall stems carry the exotic, soft grapey dull purple flowers well above the leaves during early summer. One of the first cautleyoides to flower. Needs more shade than most in a retentive soil. (5-7) 40cm.
Roscoea 'Harvington Evening Star' (AGM)	£7.30	Superb hybrid from Hugh Nunn with exotic looking deepest purple, almost black flowers with two small white flecks in the throat;- early for Roscoea often from May onwards. Best in a cool, moist yet retentive soil in part shade. Mulch in cold winters. (6-8) 25cm.
Roscoea humeana 'Harvington Raw Silk' (AGM)	£7.30	New hybrid from Hugh Nunn. rather cautleyoides like with exotic palest ivory white flowers from May onwards. Fleshy, stem clasping leaves. Best in a retentive yet well drained soil in part shade. Mulch in cold winters. (6-9) 25cm.
Roscoea humeana 'Harvington Royale'	£7.30	New hybrid bred by Hugh Nunn. One of the earliest to flower, often early May. exotic, orchid like grape-purple flowers with long, drooping lower petals. Contrasting white throat. Fleshy stem clasping leaves. Retentive yet well drained soil in part shade. Mulch in cold winters. Ht to 25cm.
Roscoea humeana 'Long Acre Sunrise'	£6.20	Plantfinder lists this is humeana but possibly a cautleyoides cross. Short, fleshy stem clasping leaves topped by long tubed palest moonlight yellow flowers from early to late summer. Best in a well drained, cool, woodland soil in part shade. (5-7) 35cm.
Roscoea humeana 'Rosemoor Plum'	£4.80	Stocky, compact form & one of the first Roscoeas into flower. Thick textured, stem clasping fleshy green leaves. Very large, sombre dusky plum flowers nestle in the crown as early as May. Dormant by late summer. Retentive, woodland soil in part shade. 45cm.
Roscoea humeana 'Stephanie Bloom'	£6.75	Bred at Blooms of Bressingham, this short form offers some of the largest flowers. Good sized, exotic, rich purple flowers with an almost unmarked throat, during June & July. Thick stems with broad, fleshy, stem clasping leaves. Humus rich, retentive yet well drained soil in part shade (6-7) 30cm.

Roscoea purpurea 'Ant Marian'	£5.20	New hybrid from Rene Zijzerveld, a tall purpurea with very large soft lavender-lilac flowers, with the larger rounded fall almost white, a lot paler than the rest of the flower. Flowers June & July, Fleshy, stem clasping leaves. Rich, retentive, well drained soil in part shade. (6-7) 45cm.
Roscoea purpurea 'Julie's Glory'	£5.20	
Roscoea purpurea f. rubra	£9.70	Formerly known as 'Red Gurkha'. this created such a stir when first introduced. Very late into growth, sometimes into June or July. exotic, orchid like, tomato-red flowers with white marked throat, during mid to late autumn. Needs a more sheltered position than most in a woodland soil with some shade. (8-10) 30cm.
Roscoea purpurea 'Spice Island'	£5.80	A new hybrid, said to be an improvement on 'Brown Peacock'. Erect, fleshy stems are dark reddish-brown, with brown flushed, stem clasping leaves. Elegantly poised, soft-lilac flowers over a long period through summer. Best in a rich, woodland soil in part or full shade. (6-8) 40cm.
Roscoea purpurea 'Summer Snow'	£5.20	Narrow, elegant white flowers with the two lower petals faintly flushed lilac. Flowers mid to late summer. Fleshy, stem clasping smooth green leaves. Humus rich, well drained soil in part shade. (7-8) 40cm.
Roscoea purpurea 'Twin Towers'	£5.20	Very distinct hybrid with long, narrow, soft purple flowers with a prominent, forward jutting lower lip. Small white throat. Red flushed stems with very long, fleshy green, horizontally held leaves. Flowers midsummer. Best in a cool, retentive, rich soil with some shade. (7-8) 40cm.
Roscoea purpurea 'Vincent'	£5.20	Tall, strong growing, upright perennial with thick, broad, fleshy green, stem clasping leaves. Exotic, orchid-like pale purple flowers, almost with a fine, deeper veining & paler throat;- late summer & autumn. Retentive soil in part shade. (7-9) 50cm.
Roscoea purpurea 'Wisley Amethyst'	£6.75	Beautiful dwarf form with very large, exotic white flowers with a prominent lower lip, heavily streaked purple;- early summer. Broad, short, fleshy, stem clasping leaves. Cool, moist, humus rich soil in part shade. (5-7)30cm.
Roscoea scillifolia atropurpurea	£4.35	Erect stems with narrow, stem clasping fleshy-green leaves. Rather small deepest purple, almost black orchid-like flowers from the upper leaf axils in summer. Leafy, moist, yet well drained soil in part shade. (6-8) 35cm.
Roscoea scillifolia scillifolia	£4.35	The unusual ROSE-PINK form of this showy hardy ginger relative. Showy, orchid-like blooms in May & June. Clasping, glossy, fresh green leaves. Humus-rich, fertile, retentive soil in cool shade. Plant tubers deep & mulch. 40x30cm.
Roscoea 'Summer Deep Purple'	£9.10	Harvington hybrid with the award of merit for as it is quick to bulk up & is 'rather lush'. Selected auriculata this has very large, orchid like, rich purple flowers with white guidelines in the throat, from July to September. Fleshy, stem clasping leaves. Best in a woodland soil with some shade. (7-9) 35cm.
Roscoea tibetica	£4.50	One of the smallest species, forming small clumps of upright stems with stem-clasping leaves. Orchid-like, pink flowers nestle in the crown in summer. Humus rich, woodland soil in part shade in a sheltered spot. (6-7) 15cm.
Rubus arcticus	£4.50	Ground hugging, creeping, thornless bramble forming mats of red flushed, trifoliate leaves, burgundy in the autumn. Cup shaped pink flowers intermittently all season. Grows in moist shade but likely to be happy almost anywhere. (4-10) 15cm.

Rudbeckia californica	£4.50	Big, tall, back of the border daisy, rarely seen in cultivation. Tall stems with rich yellow daisies having slightly drooping petals & a long, thin, raised central cone :- late summer & autumn. Divided leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (8-10) 180cm.
Rudbeckia fulgida deamii (AGM)	£6.75 2lt	Masses of large, rayed, deep yellow flowers with a dark centre; July to September. Mounds of dark green leaves. Excellent border & cut flower with stiffish stems. Any reasonable soil in sun or light shade. 75cms.
Rudbeckia fulgida speciosa (AGM)	£4.20	Slightly more dainty subspecies with smaller, more profuse, very narrow rayed, golden flowers around a striking black eye;- late summer into autumn. Easily grown in retentive, well drained soil in sun or light shade. (7-9) 65cm.
Rudbeckia laciniata	£4.50	Large, single, GOLDEN-YELLOW daisies with a central green cone; July to September. A large, stately, upright perennial with deeply serrated leaves. Fertile soil in sun. 180x60cms.
Rudbeckia laciniata 'Goldquelle' (AGM)	£4.50	Large, double, brassy-yellow, daisy-like, upward facing flowers freely produced; late summer. Tall, upright stems with slightly lobed leaves. Probably a hybrid of R.nitida. Fertile soil in sun.
Rudbeckia laciniata 'Juligold'	£4.15	syn. 'July Gold'. Large, golden-yellow daisies, with a pronounced central cone, freely produced; July to September. Good, tall, back of the border perennial which should not need staking. Ordinary well drained soil in sun or part shade. 180x75cms.
Rudbeckia 'Little Henry'	£4.50	Shorter form of this midwest native species, often flowering rather late in autumn. The gold daisies have very narrow, quilled gappy petals around a reddish-brown cone, from mid to late autumn. simple, alternate, hairy elliptic leaves. Retentive, well drained soil in sun or part shade. (8-11) 90cm.
Rudbeckia maxima	£4.50	Large cone-like flowers with drooping golden yellow petals & a large central boss; August to October. Large rosettes of wax-coated blue-grey leaves. A plant of great presence. Ordinary soil in sun or part shade. 120x60cm.
Rudbeckia mollis	£4.50	Much like R.'Goldsturm' but with smaller black-eyed, yellow daisies on much branched stems; late summer & early autumn. Rare native of Western USA. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade.
Rudbeckia occidentalis 'Green Wizard'	£4.35	Very unusual for the flower arranger. Large central black cone with small green petals like large modified bracts; midsummer. Good bushy upright habit. Fertile retentive soil in sun or part shade.
Rudbeckia paniculata	£4.15	One of the more delicate, larger species of coneflower with airy stems topped by reflexed, golden-yellow flowers with a green tinged cone, usually a little earlier than others in mid to late summer. Deeply cut leaves. Retentive soil in sun. (7-8) 90cm.
Rudbeckia 'Peking'	£4.50	(City Series) fulgida x hirta. Bushy, autumn flowering daisies with unusual, almost double rich golden-yellow flowers, stained burgundy red around the black eye;- late summer through autumn. Very long flowering in ordinary, well drained soil in sun or part shade. 50cm.
Ruellia humilis	£4.50	Coll;-S.Pennsylvania. Rarely grown N.American native with mounds of hairy leaves. The violet blue funnel shaped flowers are produced in the leaf axils from mid to late summer. May need mulching in winter. Well drained sheltered site in sun. 60x45cm.
Ruellia strepens	£4.80	Rarely seen native of Eastern USA with branched stems carrying five petalled soft lilac-blue flowers in the upper leaf axils;- mid to late summer. Narrowly heart-shaped leaves. Any reasonable soil in sun or part shade. (7-9) 60cm.

Rumex alpinus	£6.50	5.00	Rarely seen high alpine species found in the high Austrian Alps often growing in snow melt. Huge basal leaves to 80cm deeply veined & glossy green. Stout panicles of small greeny-red flowers are impressive. Very vigorous in moist soil in sun. (7-9) 120cm.
